# THE NAMES OF THOSE PERSONS

### IN THE COUNTY OF SURREY

## WHO CONTRIBUTED TO THE LOAN TO KING CHARLES I.

THE Volume in which these names occur is included amongst the Add. MSS. (No. 11,291) in the British Museum, and is lettered "Loans to the King, 1625, &c. Mus. Brit. Presented by Rt. Hon. Sir J. Newport, Bart., Comptroller-General." Inside is the date of presentation, 18th January, 1838, and the title "Loan to King Charles the 1<sup>st</sup> 1625 from the original book in the Custody of the R<sup>t</sup> Honourable Sir John Newport, Bar<sup>t</sup> (Comptroller Generall of the Exchequer) and by him presented to the British Museum. F. Devon. 1838."

The MS. begins with drafts of a Letter to the Th-,<sup>1</sup> touching the articles for the Loan, p. 1; do. to the Lord Lieutenants, p. 2; do. to the Lord Privy Seal, p. 5; do. to the Collectors, p. 6; do. to the Collectors for the Marchant Strangers, p. 8; do. to the "Lord Lieutenants concerning the certifying, p. 9." After these is a "List of Persons who lent money in the following Counties." This occupies most of the book from pp. 12 to 275, and is followed by "Divers Counties," 1st List, p. 276; 2nd List, p. 282; "Judges and Sergeants" [to be assessed], p. 280. The first "List of Marchant Strangers" is found on p. 11, and the 2nd on p. 238. Towards the end of the MS. is a "Minute of Privy Seales directed to Kn<sup>ts</sup> and Gentlemen of severall Counties," p. 276.

In the letters the King states that "he has resolved for supplie of o<sup>r</sup>  $p\bar{n}t$  wants to borrow of such of o<sup>r</sup> subjects as shal be of abilitie some competent somes of money by lifes under o<sup>r</sup> privie seale to be directed unto them severallie w<sup>ch</sup> are likewise to serve them for securitie and warrant of repayment."

The Lieutenant of every shire is to consult with his deputies what persons are most likely to be able to contribute and make certificate (*i.e.*, in other words, who are most worth being squeezed); persons unequal to the burden of assessment to be discharged on certificate to that effect. "Should persons of good means have been omitted at the first, and good reason exists to believe they are well able to contribute, this may be by way of increase on the sums already certified, or by the addition of their names if not returned before."

The names of likely contributors, their dwellings, and the "somes" they may be likely to spare (to be repayed within 18 months) are to be noted; the collectors are to remit "competent" sums received (apparently within 12 daies), and to pay them into his Majesty's Exchequer, and allowance (? commission) is to be made to them for sending up the said money.

In the Letter to the Lord Lieutenants, after mentioning that "His Ma<sup>tie</sup> was pleased in September last" to send letters giving direction that they should inform themselves "of all such persons within yor Lieutennicie as were fitt to contribute by way of Loane any competent some of money for supplie of his Mats pressing occacions for the publique services of importance then in hand still continuing and that a booke of the names of such psons fitt to lend with their dwelling places and the somes to be charged upon them should be certified unto us with all convenient speed and at the furthest within Twenty daies . . . . he cannot but take it ill that in all this time after three moneths expired no manner of answere or certificate is made by yor Lop either to his Matie or us . . . . not doubting but that yo<sup>r</sup> Lo<sup>p</sup> will take a pnt course to give his Ma<sup>tie</sup> satisfaccon concerning the premisses. We bid yor Lop hartilie farewell."

"From Hampton Court the 28<sup>th</sup> day of December 1625.

"Yor Lops very loving frinds

"J. Ley J. Mandeville E. Worcester Pembroke E. Conwey T. Edmonds Rich. Weston."

From the foregoing it is very evident how distasteful this forced loan must have been to the people generally, and difficult to levy.

The parliament had refused assistance to the King for the war with Spain, as they distrusted his policy towards the Church, and his apparent leaning towards ecclesiastics holding Roman rather than Reformed views; the practice adopted in Elizabeth's reign was reverted to of "tuning the pulpits," that is; the Clergy preached that as Church and State were one, it was the duty of the people to meet the charge of the war in a liberal way, since it had been entered upon (as was alleged) with full consent of parliament.

Quite at the end of the book, on page 286, we have, "The Names of such psons as were discharged of their severall privie Seales by lies from the Lords and others of His Ma<sup>ties</sup> Most honourable privie Councell directed to the Lo' Privie Seale."

A like (*i.e.*, a discharge) to Elizabeth Monke of the County of Surrey for 40<sup>li</sup>. Dat. 7° Marcij 1625.

A like (*i.e.*, a discharge) unto George Shiers of the County of Surrey for 20<sup>th</sup>. Dat. 12° Januar 1625.

When we come to the Catalogue of Contributors, the pedigrees of almost all of the knights and esquires who belonged to the "County" families will be found in the "Visitation of Surrey in 1623," printed in the Society's *Collections* (in Vols. 1, II, III, IV, V, VI, VII, VIII, X, XI, XII), and in *The Visitations of the County of Surrey made and taken in the Years* 1530, 1572, and 1623, edited by W. Bruce Bannerman, F.S.A., London, 1899, and published by the Harleian Society.

Of the yeomen who subscribed, the List contains many names well known in the County; but the history of the yeoman families (in all our counties) remains to be written, and it is to this field that the genealogists of the future will have to direct their attention, since from this sturdy and independent class have sprung many of our ablest men of science, physicians, lawyers and divines.

Moreover, where ten might feel a direct *personal* interest in the great landed families, a hundred should in the latter, as their own progenitors.

I have corrected two or three obvious mistakes made by the copyist in transcribing the original MS.
