

Whittlewood Manors in Domesday Book

Akeley

Robert holds Akeley from Walter. It answers for 3 hides. Land for 4 ploughs, in lordship 4 oxen, 2 ploughs possible. 2 villagers with 4 smallerholders have 2 ½ ploughs. 2 slaves, meadow for 1 plough; woodland, 800 pigs and 6. The total value is and was 40s.; before 1066, 60s. Alric son of Goding held this manor; he could sell.

Boycott

Reinbald holds 1 hide in Boycott from the King. Land for 3 ploughs. Now in lordship 1 plough, with 1 villager. Woodland 4 furlongs long and 2 wide. The value was 40s.; now 20s. Blackman held it freely.

Dadford

In Dadford Haimard holds 2 hides from Roger as one manor. Land for 4 ploughs, 1 there; a further 3 possible. 4 smallholders and 1 slave. Meadow for 4 ploughs; woodland, 200 pigs. In total, the value is and was 20s.; before 1066, 30s. Leofwin, Burgred's man, held this manor; he could grant or sell

Hugh, so on Gozhere holds 2 hides in Dadford from the King in alms. Land for 4 ploughs; 1 there, 3 possible. 3 smallholders. Meadow for 4 ploughs; woodland, 200 pigs. The value is and was 20s., before 1066, 40s. Two thanes, Raven and Wulfward, held this land; they could sell.

Furtho

He [Ralph] also holds 2 hides in Furtho. Land for 6 ploughs. In lordship 1; 4 slaves; 2 villagers and 3 smallholders with 1 plough. Meadow, 8 acres. The value was 10s.; now 30s. Godman and Godiva held it freely.

Lampton

In Lampton Berner holds 3 ½ hides from Walter as one manor. Land for 4 ploughs; in lordship 1; another possible. 2 villagers with 2 smallholders have 2 ploughs. 2 slaves; meadow for 2 ploughs; woodland, 50 pigs. The value is and always was 40s. Swein Swarthy, Earl Edwin's man, held this manor; he could sell.

In Lampton Gerard holds 2 ½ hides from Mainou. Land for 3 ploughs; in lordship 1. 1 villager with 3 smallholders has 1 plough; another possible. 1 slave; meadow for 1 plough; woodland, 40 pigs. In total, value 30s.; when acquired 16 s.; before 1066, 30s. Raven, Bishop Wulfwy's man, held this land; he could sell.

Leckhampstead

Glibert Maminot holds Leckhampstead from the Bishop. It answers for 18 hides. Land for 12 ploughs, 1 lordship 3, a fourth is possible. 18 villagers with 6 smallholders have 4 ploughs; another 4 possible. 2 slaves; meadow for 12 ploughs; woodland, 400 pigs. The total value is and was £6; before 1066 £8. Earl Leofwin held this manor.

In Leckhampstead Hugh holds 2 hides from Walter. Land for 1 plough; it is there, with 1 villager; 2 smallholders and 1 slave. 1 mill at 20d.; meadow for 1 plough; woodland, 50 pigs. Total value 30s.; when acquired 20s.; before 1066, 30s. Swarting, Asgar the Constable's man, held this manor; he could neither sell nor grant without this permission.

In Leckhampstead, Osbern holds 3 hides from Geoffrey. Land for 3 ploughs; in lordship 1. [...] villagers have 1 ½ ploughs; a further ½ plough possible. Woodland, 150 pigs. Value 30s.,

when acquired 20s.; before 1066, 30s. Swarting, Asgar's man, held this manor, he could not sell.

Lillingstone Dayrell

Hugh holds Lillingstone Dayrell from Walter. It answers for 5 hides. Land for 5 ploughs; in lordship 1 ½; another ½ possible. 6 villagers with 5 smallholders have 2 ploughs; a third possible. Meadow for 5 ploughs; woodland, 1,200 pigs. Value 60s.; when acquired 40s.; before 1066, 50s. Seric, Queen Edith's man, held this manor; he could sell.

Lillingstone Lovell

Benzelin holds Lillingstone Lovell from the King. 2 ½ hides. Land for 2 ploughs. Now in lordship 1 plough. 3 villagers with 1 smallholder have 1 plough. Woodland 10 furlongs long and 5 furlongs wide. The value is and was 40s. Azor held it freely before 1066.

Richadr the Artificer holds 2 ½ hides in Lillingstone Lovell from the King. Land for 2 ploughs. 1 hide and 1 virgate of this land is in lordship. 5 villagers with 1 smallholder and 1 slave have two ploughs. Woodland 10 furlongs long and 5 furlongs wide. The value was 40s.; now 60s.

Passenham

The King holds Passenham. 1 hide. Land for 12 ploughs. In lordship 1, with 1 slave; 8 villagers and 6 smallholders with 1 freeman who have 5 ploughs. A mill at 13s. 4d.; meadow, 30 acres; woodland 1 league long and as wide. Puxley belongs to this manor. ½ hide. Land for 1 plough. 1 freeman who has ½ plough and pays 5s. The whole paid £8 at face value before 1066; now £10.

Reginald holds from the King ½ hide in Passenham. He has 1 plough with 4 smallholders. Value 10s.

In Cosgrove, 5 parts of 1 hide. The jurisdiction lies in Passenham. Land for 1 ½ ploughs; they are all there, with 4 smallholders. Meadow 10 acres; underwood, 2 furlongs. The value was and is 20s. Alric held it freely.

Potterspury

Henry of Ferrers holds 3 hides and the fifth part of 1 hide in Potterspury. Land for 10 ploughs. In lordship 3 ploughs; 3 slaves. 20 villagers and 7 smallholders with a priest have 7 ploughs. A mill at 18s. 4d.; meadow, 16 acres; woodland, 6 furlongs and 14 perches long and 2 ½ furlongs wide. The value was and is £6. Earl Tostig held it.

William Peverel holds 1 hide and the fifth part of 1 hide in Potterspury. Land for 3 ploughs. In lordship 1; 2 slaves. 6 villagers with 3 smallholders have 2 ploughs. Meadow, 5 acres; woodland, 4 furlongs long and 2 furlongs wide. The value was and is 30s. Bishop held it freely.

Silverstone

In Silverstone 1 hide. Land for 3 ploughs. In lordship 1, with 1 slave. The value was 10s.; now 20s. Leofric held it freely.

Godwin holds ½ hide from Giles in Silverstone. Land for 1 plough. 2 villagers. Meadow, 3 acres. Woodland 1 ½ leagues long and 1 league wide. The fourth part of this woodland belongs to this land. The value was 2s.; now 5s. Siward held it freely.

Arnold holds ½ hide from Geoffrey in Silverstone. Land for 1 plough; it is there, with 2 slaves. 1 villager and 1 smallholder. The value was 10s.; now 20s.

Stowe

Robert d'Oilly and Robert of Ivry hold Stowe from the Bishop. It answers for 5 hides. Land for 5 ploughs, in lordship 1; a further 2 possible. 3 smallholders have $\frac{1}{2}$ plough; another $1\frac{1}{2}$ possible. Meadow for 6 ploughs; woodland, 50 pigs. Value 40s.; when acquired waste; before 1066, 60s. Thorgils, Baldwin, son of Herlwin's man, held this manor; he could sell.

Wakefield

Count Alan holds 4 parts of $\frac{1}{2}$ hide from the King in Wakefield and Ralph the Steward from him. Land for 2 ploughs. In lordship 1. Meadow, 1 acre; woodland $5\frac{1}{2}$ furlongs long and 3 furlongs wide. The value was 5s.; now 10s.

Wicken

Robert d'Oilly holds 1 hide and 1 virgate of land in Wicken and Roger from him. Land for 10 ploughs. In lordship 3 ploughs, 7 slaves. 7 villagers and 3 smallholders with 4 ploughs. Meadow, 10 acres; woodland, 11 furlongs long and 6 furlongs wide. The value was 40s.; now 100s. Azor held it freely before 1066

He [Mainou] also holds 3 virgates of land in Wicken. Land for 3 ploughs, In lordship 2 ploughs, with 1 slave. 5 villagers with 1 smallholder have 2 ploughs. Meadow, 6 acres; woodland 10 furlongs long and 3 furlongs wide. The value was and is 40s. Siward held it freely.
