


ST. MARTIN'S CHURCH, CANTERBURY



































- B. S. face of Hawkesworth Gap showing line of gravel pan below assumed earlier ground surface






CASTLE STREET, NORWICH






A. SURREY ST., KING'S LYNN, NORFOLK
