

The Churchwardens' Accounts of the Parish of St. Mary, Thame.

Commencing in the year 1442.

Transcribed by W. Patterson Ellis.

HE accounts commence in 1442 with a statement from the statement Churchwardens of what is due to them and the items of indebtedness. On the next page we have a list of the altars (or lights as they are generally called) with the names of the Wardens in charge of them. Here there is evidently a page or two missing as we come next to the remains of a subscription list the money collected being towards the rebuilding of the north aisle a parvise over it and a rood loft.

Then begins a very detailed account of the expenses incurred in the rebuilding. There is no difficulty in making out what everything cost. Stone, lime, sand, labour, all are given. The churchwardens certainly deserved much credit for the way in which the restoration was carried out.

I must remind your readers that to come at the values of the various items in comparison with the prices of the present day, the prices given in these accounts must be multiplied by twenty as that about represents the purchasing power of money then as compared to now. Another interesting feature is that at this period men still took their surnames from the trade that they worked at; almost every trade will be found represented in the surnames given in the accounts.

Under the head of receipts are many curious gifts and legacies such as "a vale worked by the maydens," which sold for 23/-, an enormous sum in those days for a piece of embroidery.

The spelling will be found quaint, and where the meaning is obscure I have tried as far as possible to give the meaning.
