ST. GILES' PARISH.

Imprimis a chalys without a patten ; iij belles in the steple ;
[a hande bell] ; ij syrples ; Fower table clothes for the lords borde ;
a herse clothe of yellow sylke ; A wyne bottell of pewtre.

ST. MARY MAGDALEN'S PARISH.

One challes of sylver with ought a paten ; thre great belles ; a
herse clothe to cover the deede ; a bottel of tyne ; iiij altre clothes
for the lords bord ; an old clothe of sylke with a fringe to
make a carpet for the . . .

ST. NYCHOLAS PARISH.

A chalyce of sylver ; a vestment of blewe velvet ; a vestment of
tawney velvet ; a vestment of redd damaske ; a vestment of white
and blue bawdkyn ; a cope of grene saten ; two copes of whyte and
redd bawdkyn ; on the comunyon table a carpet of darnex and two

lynen clothes to the same ; iij surplusses ; iij belles yn the tower and a sanctus bell.

*[Delyvered by Sir William Tylcocke to the mayer for the relyef of the pore one chalys ; one pyxe of silver gilte ; i pax of sylver and of the valewe of vij powndes, xvj shyllings and vj pennys.]

[Itm. gevyn unto the body of the seyde Cytye of Oxford with the whole consent of the paryshioners of the said paryshe one chalys of silver and gylt weyyng ix vncys at vj^s vj^d the vnce [to the value of iiⁱⁱ xviii^s vj^d].

[One pyx of sylver and gylt gyven wyth the lyke concent, weyyng x vnces at vj^s vj^d the vnce [to the valewe of iiijⁱⁱ v^s].

Gyven by the like concent one pax of sylver and gylt weyyng v vncys [at six shylyngs and vj^d the unce to the valewe of xxxij^s vi^d] Sum total vijⁱⁱ xvi^s to helpe to purchace Londys for the relyeff of the poore people wythyn the seyde Cytye from tyme to tyme for ever. Item. sold certeyn copes ; veste ments and other ornaments to sundry persons to the valewe of xx^s whych seyde xx^s was gyven to the seid pore people of the seyde parysshe at sundry tymes as nede dyd requyer.

PUSEY.

Walkelin Waard or Wadard held it. He was alive about 1135-40. His daughter Helewis married Will. Avenell. Their son Walkelin Hareng held Pusey and sold it, *i.e.*, 2 hides of land, the manor house and the advowson, to Ralf de Chesney between 1179 and 1182.
