

9093	Cropmarks South of Upper Caldecote	Investigations identified Neolithic flint scatters and sporadic pit cluster; Bronze Age funerary monument, Beaker burials and Late Bronze Age boundary; Early Iron Age to Mid Iron Age settlement zone including large pits.
9094	Cropmarks Alongside Gypsy Lane, Broom	Cropmarks of two possible ring ditches may be geological in origin.
9095	Cropmarks North of Broom Grange, Southill	A series of Iron Age/Roman rectilinear/subrectangular enclosures lying N-S parallel to stream to the E. Linear features including double-ditched trackway(s) running to W. (Broom Extension)
14161	Hill Lane Toll House, Old Warden	A post medieval Toll House located in 1758 at the SE corner of the Hill Lane crossroads.



336	Castle Mill, Bedford	The site of a mill in the medieval period, subsequently part of farm buildings.
337	Cropmarks in North West of Willington Plantation	Excavated cropmarks of Neolithic/Bronze Age ring ditch; Bronze Age ring ditch overlaid by Iron Age/Roman shrine; Two Iron Age pennanular enclosures and pit alignments and D shaped enclosure. (Plantation Quarry)
434	Site of Manor House, Willington	The site of the manor house, later occupied by 16th century farm.
435	Dovecote of Former Manor House, Church End, Willington	Stone dovecote built in the early 16th century as part of the outbuildings belonging to the Manor House. (Grade I Listed. DBD2183. SAM 10. DBD212)
572	Palaeolithic Hand axes, Summerhouse Hill, Bedford	Two Palaeolithic hand axes were found in gravel workings at Summerhouse Hill. Large quantities of animal remains were also reportedly found.
585	Causewayed Enclosure and Other Cropmarks, Roman Occupation, Cardington	Cropmark of Neolithic causeway enclosure, overlain by Roman enclosure, which was excavated in 1951.
586	South West of Octagon Farm, Cardington	Investigations recorded a palaeolithic flint knife; Late Neolithic/Early Bronze Age flint scatter and three Late Neolithic/Bronze Age ring ditches (Associated with monument complex within HER 1480); Late Iron Age/Roman enclosure settlement with paddocks; 2nd -3rd century possible settlement and field system. Early-Mid Saxon settlement and evidence of continuation of activity from Late Roman period. (Octagon Farm South, Willington Quarry)

1358	Old Sand Pit, Cople	An old sand quarry pit shown on the Ordnance Survey, c.1882.
1409	Building at Well, Willington	A building shown on a map of c.1795.
1478	Cropmarks, Willington	Cropmarks of ring ditches and enclosures (See HER 337, 15222). (Willington Plantation Quarry)
1480	Cropmarks, Octagon Farm, South of River Ouse, Cardington/Cople	Extensive prehistoric 'ritual landscape' on gravel terrace, defined by R Ouse to N & Elstow Brook to S. Comprises ring ditch/henge monuments, long mortuary enclosures, cursus(es), etc. (Castlemill Airfield/Octagon Farm, Willington Quarry)
1618	Cropmarks, North of Dog Farm, Cople	Ring ditches (2 destroyed by gravel extraction), and linear cropmarks (enclosures). Excavations of one ring ditch (J F Dyer) produced evidence of Iron Age cremation. Trenching in 2006 found a probable double ring ditch. (Dog Farm Quarry)



1830		An area of dense cropmarks indicating enclosures and droveways. Archaeological investigations recorded Neolithic to Bronze Age flint scatters; EIA and MIA dispersed settlement features; LIA enclosures. Roman boundaries and medieval ridge and furrow.
1861	Cropmarks South of Willington	Very extensive area of complex cropmarks along an eastward-flowing stream course. Probably a Romano-British village complex, containing a possible villa site marked by very regular rectilinear enclosures. Straight double ditches of possible Roman road approach from both W and E. Scattered smaller groups of enclosures to S and E.
1905	Goldington, Bedford	An area of cropmarks partly excavated prior to development. Two henges later used as Bronze Age burial sites and evidence of Iron Age and Roman field systems were recorded.
2806	Howbury Ringwork, Renhold	A medieval ringwork, divided in two by a later roadway. (SAM 20441, DBD1303)
3098	Gravel Pit, Willington	The site of a gravel pit shown on the 1902 Ordnance Survey.


