APPENDIX 4 ALSF ARCUS Database Results

INTRODUCTION

The ARCUS database developed from a pilot study undertaken in Derbyshire, Nottinghamshire and Oxfordshire in 2007; its aims were to assemble a database of known archaeological fieldwork projects on hard and soft aggregate extraction sites, to identify those sites with incomplete or inadequate levels of dissemination, and to assess the potential of these sites.

The Bedfordshire ARCUS Database Results

A total of fifty records were entered into the Bedfordshire ARCUS database and they represent the known extent of archaeological inventions undertaken as a result of aggregate extraction.

Period 0 (Pre 1900)

Five records were created for extraction sites where archaeological fieldwork had been recorded for the period prior to 1900 and the nature of the primary fieldwork for all the records was categorised as antiquarian/amateur observation and finds collections. The basic details of these projects are summarised below in table 1.

CONCLUSIONS

The Bedfordshire ARCUS database represents a comparatively small number of projects; however they demonstrate that there has been a relationship between the archaeological resource and the aggregate producing geologies since 19th century.

Basic statistics show that 52% of all projects are considered to be adequately disseminated. However this number is actually misleading; of the 48% records which have not been fully disseminated, 42% represent projects undertaken in Period 4 which are ongoing and of the final 6%, two of the projects (4%) are close to publication. This means that only 2% of the records have actually not been adequately disseminated.

Unfortunately the 2% of inadequately disseminated sites represents the archaeological excavations at Warren Villas Quarry. The post excavation of this site is currently in stasis; the last publication was in 1996 when a short summary report was produced for *Bedfordshire Archaeology* (Dawson and Maull 1996). Since that time English Heritage, who had been one of the original funders have refused to pay for any further work. The archaeological resource at Warren Villas is multi-period, representing a palimpsest of human activity from the Mesolithic through to the Post Medieval. It is also in close proximity to Ivel Farm (Sandy) Quarry) where a broadly comparable record has been investigated and is currently undergoing post excavation analysis. Until both sites have been fully published our knowledge of this part of the River Ivel landscape will remain limited.
