### Please note:

The database and digitised drawing supplied were established from site records created before the advent of regular use of databases and digital site drawings. As a result these represent tools created to support the post-excavation and reporting process rather than formal digital components of the fieldwork archive. As a result associated documentation and use of terminologies and established conventions is not as rigorous as would normally be expected of elements of a modern digital project archive.

The digital site images provided are scanned copies of a selection of site archive black and white photographs and colour slides.

3. Specialist ceramic data (excl Early Prehistoric) – Detailed records of all Iron Age, Romano-British and later pottery and tile.
4. Structural data – Summary data on all recorded contexts
