Extract from Jefferson's *History of Carlisle*, p. 157 (published 1838), being a foot note. In 1356 "John de Caldesmyth, chaplain, makes his will; and amongst other legacies bequeaths *Luminoribus beato Marie, Karl. infra chorum et extra in ecclesia parochiali equaliter iiii. iiijd.*"—Bp. Welton's *Register*. "Which," says Bishop Nicholson in his MSS., "plainly intimates that ye body of ye church, as at this day, was designed to the parishioners, who had nothing to do in the Quire."
