

A CORRECTION.

In the short article by Mr. N. Belaiew, entitled *A Note on the use of Russian and Norse measurements by early Norman builders*, which appeared in *Arch. Journ.* vol. lxxvii, pp. 190, 191, reference was made to the conclusions formed upon this subject by the Rev. T. C. Walters, formerly vicar of Cockington, and now rector of Highweek, Devon. Mr. Walters has written to us, pointing out that these conclusions should be attributed, not to him, but to Mr. Hugh R. Watkin, of Chelston Hall, Torquay, who published them in 1914 in a pamphlet issued for the benefit of the endowment fund of Cockington church. A copy of this publication has been sent to us by Mr. Watkin, and, after examining it, we desire to express regret that our contributor should have given credit for the origin of the theory to the wrong person. The mistake, however, is easily explained by the fact that, while Mr. Walters' name appears upon the first leaf of the pamphlet, that of Mr. Watkin is attached only to some chronological notes on the history of the church, and there is no definite indication of the authorship of the concluding note on measurements, which includes figures derived from the original dimensions of Torre abbey church and the churches of St. Marychurch, Kingskerswell, Tormohun and Cockington.
