## EIGHTY-EIGHTH REPORT OF THE COUNCIL FOR THE YEAR 1929

The Council have the honour to present their report for 1929.

During the year the Institute has lost seven members by death and eight members by resignation, and three libraries have ceased to subscribe. Fortyeight new members have been elected and seven new libraries have been added to the list.

The total membership is as follows:---

451 Subscribing members (including life members).

130 Libraries.

3 Honorary and corresponding members.

Among those who have passed away the Council regret to record the deaths of two honorary vice-presidents, Prof. Sir W. Boyd-Dawkins (past president) and Mr. C. E. Keyser, who joined the Institute in 1874. Sir W. Boyd-Dawkins was a constant attendant at the meetings and made many valued contributions to the Journal.

The Summer Meeting was held at Canterbury, and was the fourth occasion on which the Institute visited the City, the previous years being 1844, 1875 and 1896. The meeting was organised by Lt.-Col. B. S. Browne.

The Spring Meeting was held at Waltham Abbey and the Autumn Meeting at Penshurst Place and Tonbridge. The Institute is indebted to Mr. A. W. Clapham, F.S.A., for his services in the former, and to Mr. Aymer Vallance, F.S.A., and to Mr. John W. Little, F.R.I.B.A., for their help at the latter meeting.

Wednesday, 4th December, 1929, 'Walter Morgan's illustrated diary of his campaign in Holland with William the Silent in 1572–1574.' By The President.

The remaining volumes 84 (1927) edited by Dr. Rose Graham and 85 and 86 (1928 and 1929) by Dr. Mortimer Wheeler are already in the press and will be issued in 1930. In accordance with the rule passed at the last General Meeting, the Council has appointed Dr. Mortimer Wheeler honorary editor.

The audited accounts for the year are attached to this report. After provision has been made for the arrears of publication, there remains a sum of £157 17s. 9d., which has been added to Reserve.


