- 1 Small Find 61. Stem, stamped RICH/GREEN/LAND, and remains of bowl c.1700-1710. Made by Richard Greenland of Norton St. Philip, near Bath.
- 2 Small Find 407. Bowl of c.1760-1800.
- 3 Small Find 218. Bowl, spur embossed C/W. Probably made by partnership of Thomas Clarke and Richard Ward of Bath, c.1790-1800.
- 4 Small Find 230. Bowl of c.1810-1840, with remains of long stem.
- 5 Small Find 321. Small bowl with leaves embossed along mould seams.
- 6 Small Find 30. Ribbed or fluted bowl, spur embossed J/S, with remains of long stem. Made by Joseph Sants of Bath, c.1850-1880.
- 7 Small Find 58. Plain bowl, spur embossed J/S. Made by Joseph Sants of Bath, c.1835-1880.
- 8 Small Find 55. 'Beaded' or 'French Cutty' bowl, c.1850-1920.
- 9 Small Find 194. 'Football Pipe', c.1889-1920. Stem complete.
- 10 Small Find 53. 'Miner Pipe', c.1850-1900.
- 11 Small Find 47. Porcelain pipe of the Berliner Stummel type, made in Germany c.1875-1900. Upper half of bowl white, lower half dark brown. Complete.
- 12 Small Find 494. Porcelain pipe, probably made in Germany c.1875-1900, depicting church tower flanked by foliage and with path in foreground below. Remains of copper lid survive on rim of bowl. Complete.
