Edward Martyn Jope (1915–96), founder of the Department of Archaeology at the Queen's University of Belfast, medievalist and specialist in the study of the Iron Age art of the British Isles, is the subject of a Memoir (Addyman, P., 2014. 'Edward Martyn Jope 1915–1996', *Biographical Memoirs of Fellows* XIII, British Academy, 294–311).
