15. Thomas Strong signs the Register, as Curate, in 1742, 1748, 1763. His writing begins, in the Spaldwick Register, in June, 1742, and continues until 1749, and similarly in the Stow Register. But he resigned Stow in 1790.

16. John Thompson's appointment to Long Stow occurs in the Episcopal Registers at Lincoln, but not his appointment to Easton; while John Bligh's appointment to Easton occurs, but not his appointment to Stow. They both held the two livings.

17. The Livings were consolidated by an Order in Council, 1869, which came into force on the death of John Bligh. (See note to Spaldwick).
