

As members know, the Cambs. and Hunts. Archaeological Society has been incorporated in the Cambridge Antiquarian Society, and this part ends the seven volumes of its Transactions issued during the last fifty two years. It is hoped that as many as possible will continue to pay their subscriptions now to the Treasurer of the C.A.S., R. B. Whitehead, Esq., Litt.D., 30, Millington Road, Cambridge. They can become Associate Members, not receiving the Proceedings, for a subscription of fifteen shillings per annum or full members at £1-5-0.

Huntingdonshire will receive particular attention through the Advisory Committee for Hunts., which will be elected at the annual meeting of the C.A.S., Huntingdonshire members alone voting. The Advisory Committee will nominate two members for the Council and one for the Editorial Committee.

ANNUAL REPORT OF COUNCIL 1950—51

The Council begs to report that there is a membership of sixty-four, three new members have been elected and six either resigned or have been struck off as they have not paid their subscriptions. Vol. VII, Part III, has been issued and Part IV is in the Press. Part III was the Jubilee number and a little beyond our means, but, thanks to donations, the Society was not in debt.

Two Excursions were held, the summer one to Bourn, Harlton, Orwell and Great Gransden, which was followed by tea given there by Mr. and Mrs. Johnson, of Ripington Manor. The former described his house and its history.

The Autumn Excursion was to Broughton, Warboys, Bury and Ramsey. The Canteen at Ramsey Abbey provided us with tea through the kind offices of Mr. Barnes, the Head Master.

The Council recommends the election of Mr. Tebbutt and Dr. Garrood to the Council for British Archaeology, and to Group 7 of that body. Also that Dr. Garrood's name be submitted to the Huntingdonshire County Council for co-option to the County Town and Country Planning Committee.

Mr. Tebbutt has continued the Photographic Record, and Mr. Ladds' negatives have been deposited at the Norris Museum and Library.

The blocks and reserve numbers of the Transactions are now at St. Neots at Messrs. Tomson and Lendrum's works.

The following members of Council retire in rotation and are eligible for re-election: Mrs. Priestly, Messrs. Saltmarsh and Dickinson. The Council recommends their re-election.

The Council has elected Mr. Findlay to the Council in the place of Mrs. Hutton, resigned.

The Council recommends the re-election of the officers for the coming year and thanks all who have helped the Society.

An Excursion was held on the 21st of June, 1952, to Alconbury Hill, Alconbury, Woolley, Stow Longa, Ellington and Huntingdon. Mrs. Garrood entertained the Society to morning coffee. Picnic lunch was on the Revd. Morley Wells' and Mrs. Wells' lawn and in their drawing room, and after a visit to the Huntingdon museum a most satisfactory tea party was given by Miss Goodliff at her house. A very enjoyable day.
