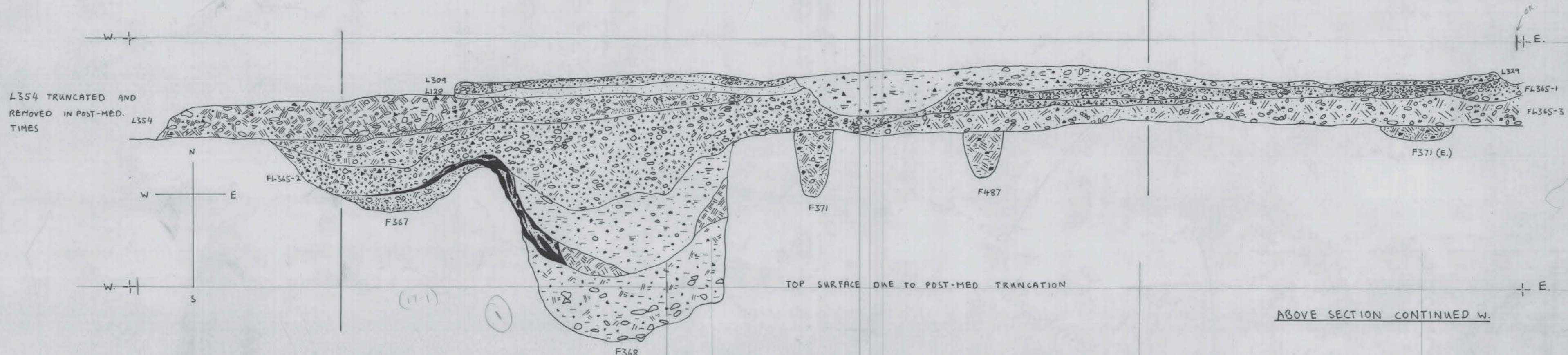

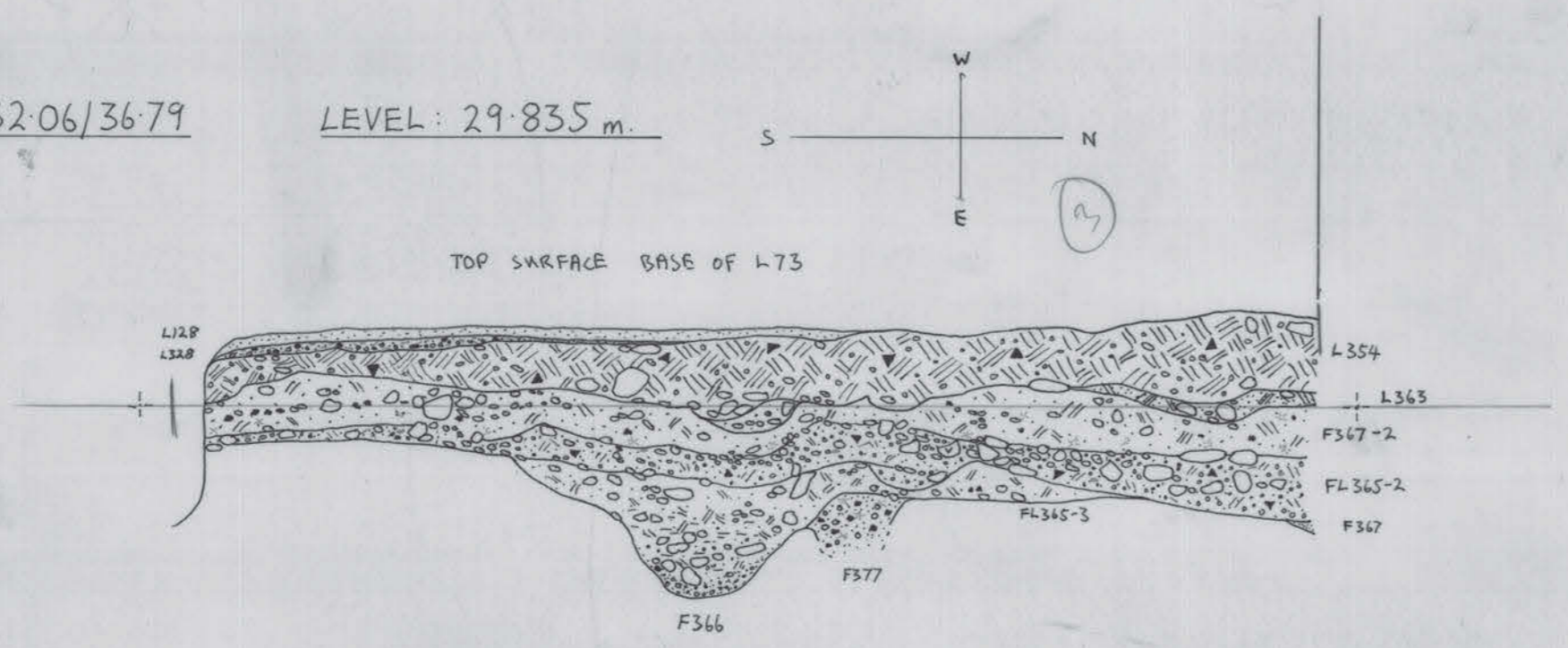

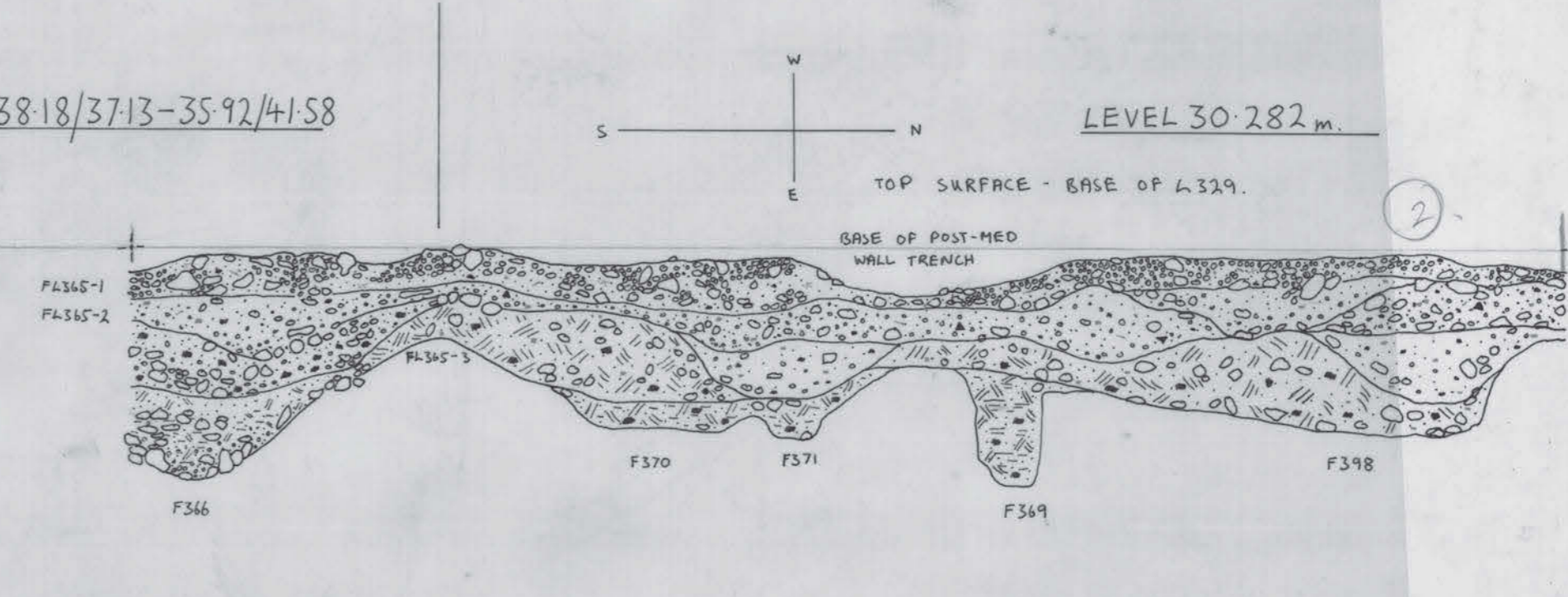

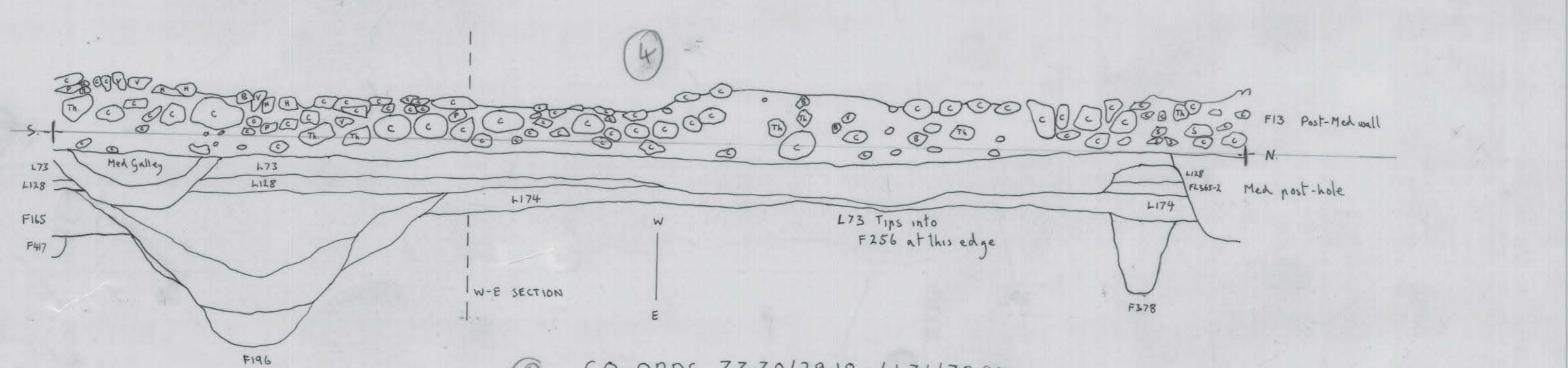

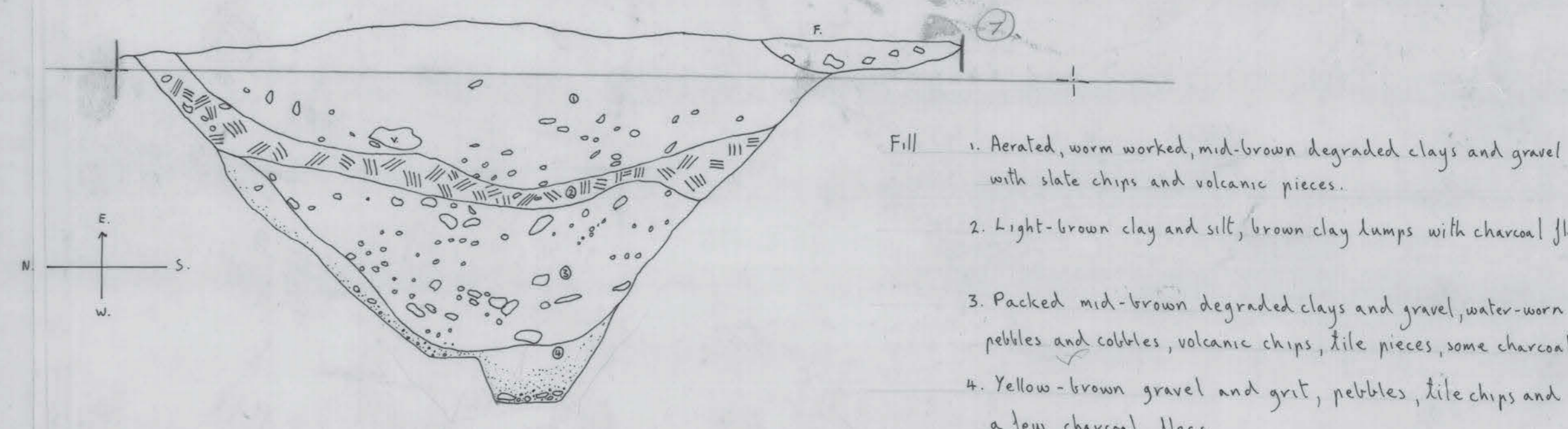

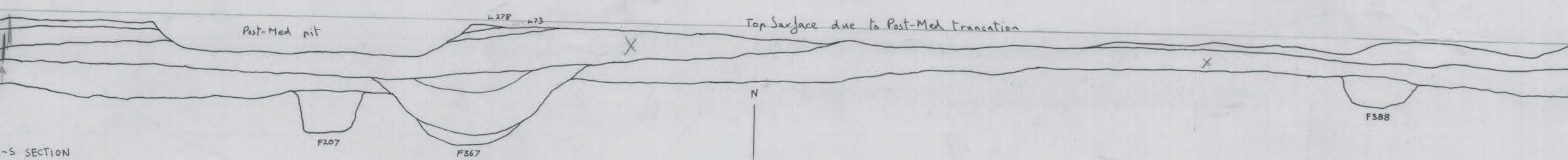

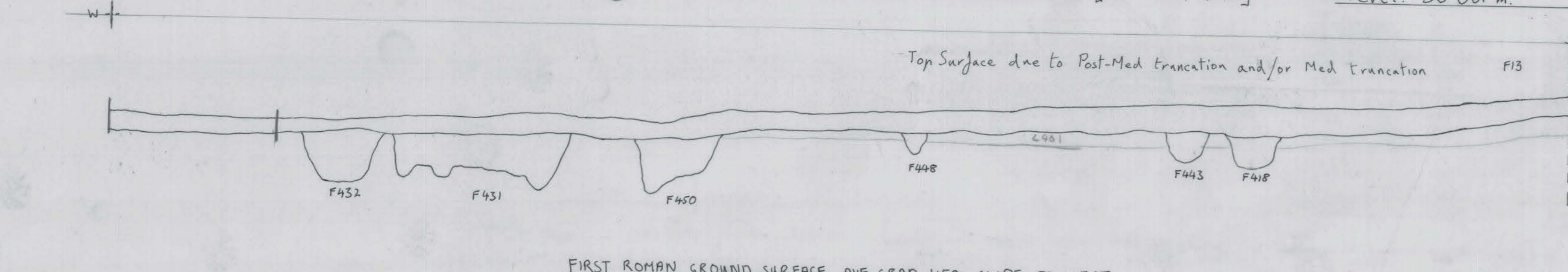

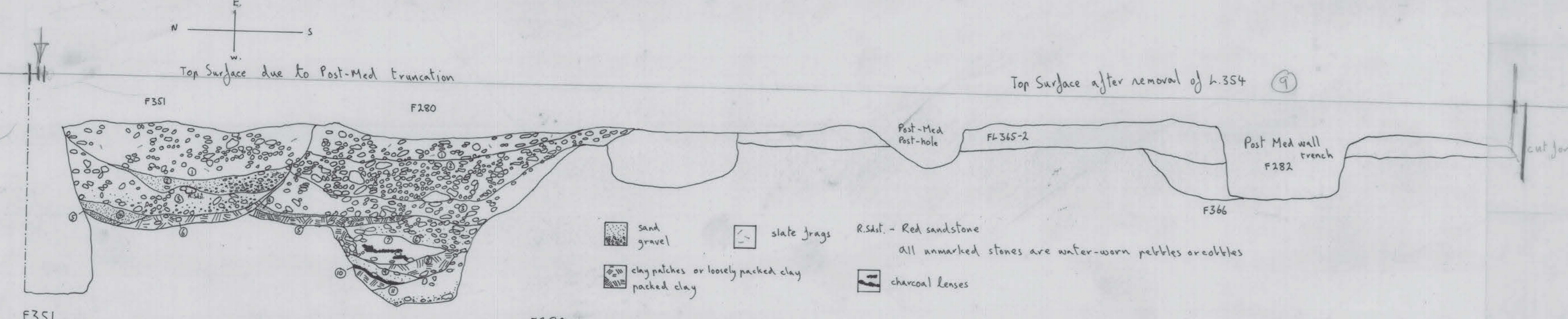

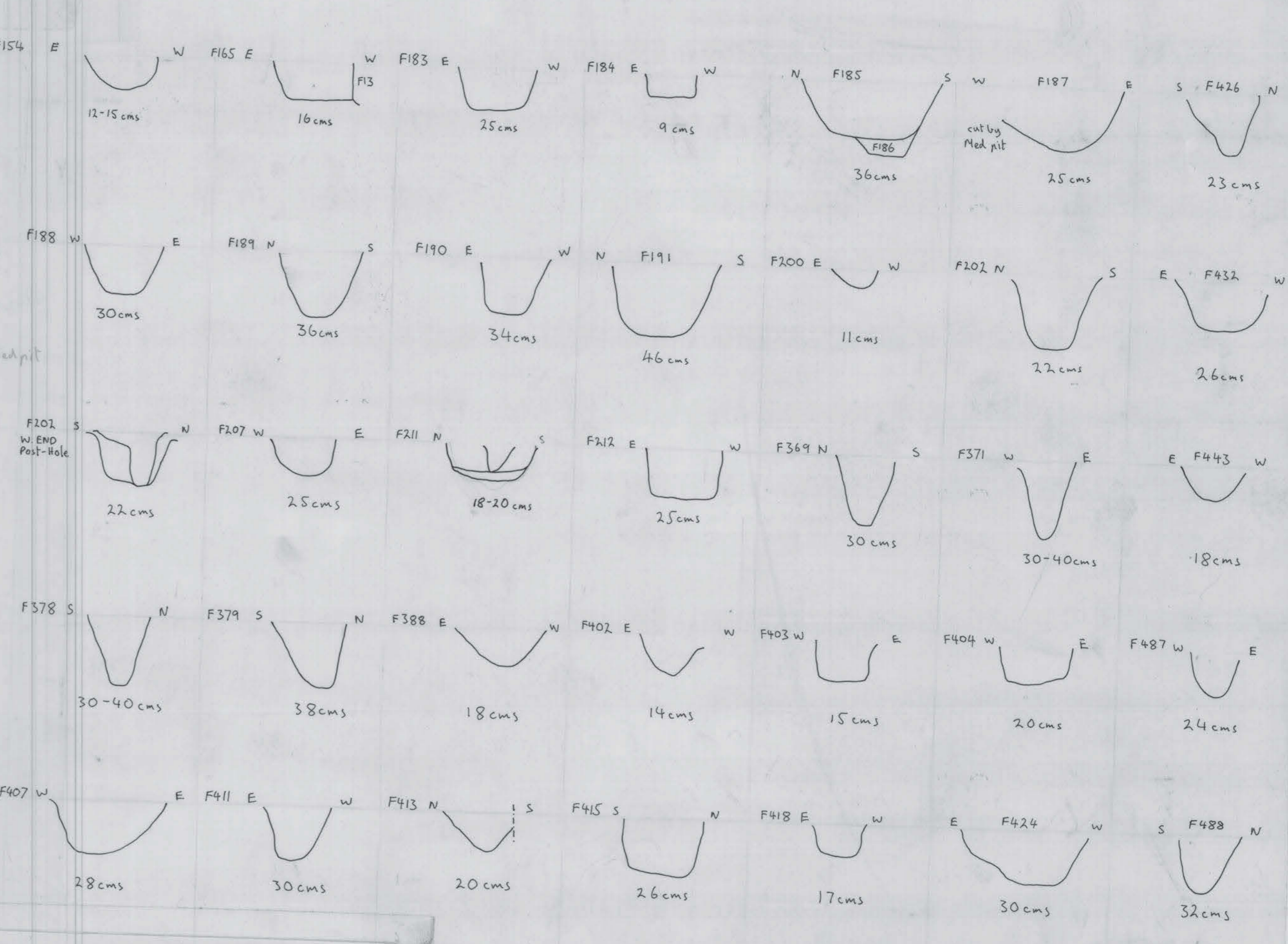


- F351 Fill**
- 1. Dark-brown degraded clays with water-worn pebbles, tile flecks and slate frags.
- 2. Orange sand with gravel, iron panings grits and small pebbles, noticeably to South.
- 3. Red-brown mottled degraded clay with gravel and iron panings grits, water-worn pebbles to South.
- 4. Fine orange sand with occasional charcoal flecks.
- 5. Fine pure light yellow sand.
- 6. Aerated dark red-brown clay with thin patches of fine light-brown sand above.
- F280 Fill**
- 1. Dark-brown degraded clays and gravel with water-worn pebbles, charcoal, slate and tile flecks.
- 2. Mid-brown degraded clays and gravel with an abundance of water-worn pebbles and cobbles.
- 3. Dark-brown degraded clays, iron panings, water-worn pebbles.
- 4. Fine light-orange sand.
- 5. Rich-brown clay and silt with occasional charcoal flecks and iron panings.
- 6. Light-red degraded clays and sand with charcoal, mortar and tile flecks.
- 7. Olive degraded clays with charcoal patches.
- 8. Dry yellow clay.
- 9. Red sand and silt with charcoal flecks.
- 10. Dark-red sand and gravel with heavy charcoal patches.
- 11. Dark-brown degraded clays with gravel, sand, cobbles, tile frags.
- 12. Yellow clay slump to North.

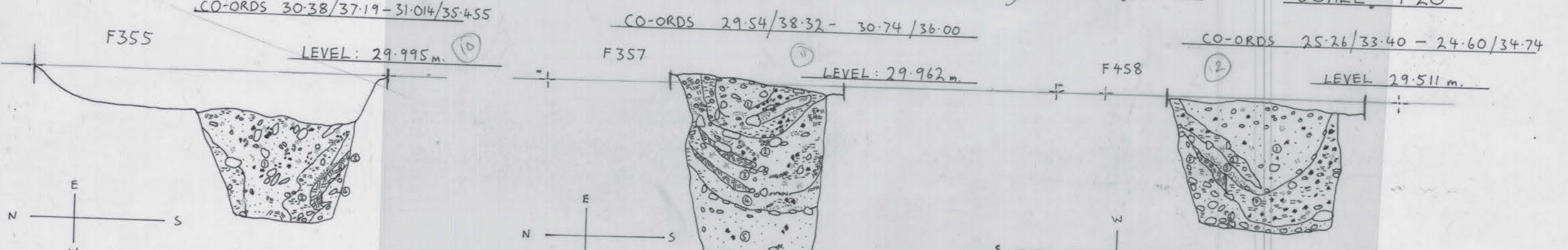
AVERAGE DEPTH RECORDED BELOW
