ART. X.—A System of numerical references to the parts of Hadrian's Wall and the structures along its line. By R. G. COLLINGWOOD.

Communicated at Kendal, September 11th, 1929.

TXCEPT near its western end, where our knowledge of f L its details is still very small, we know that Hadrian's Wall was divided into more or less equal lengths of about one Roman mile by its so-called milecastles (the place of a milecastle being sometimes taken by a fort), and each mile into three more or less equal parts by two turrets, the place of a turret being, again, sometimes taken by a fort. The present proposal is to use this ready-made system of divisions to facilitate references to the parts of the Wall itself and to the forts, milecastles, turrets and other structures on its line. Even of those who know the Wall fairly well, few have at their fingers' ends all the placenames, many of them not to be found on any map in ordinary use, by which these references are now made, and the result is that persons who are quite willing to study the work that has been done on the Wall are prevented from doing so by the impossibility of finding their way about in a maze of minute place-names. It is here proposed that the place-names in use shall be supplemented and, where convenient, replaced by series-numbers. Every turret and milecastle has its own number, and any point on the line of the Wall can be referred to as so many yards east or west of the centre-line of the nearest milecastle or turret. As the system is based on the division of the Wall into numbered Roman miles, anyone possessing a map of the Wall showing the milecastles can reconstruct the series for himself at any time, and need not trust to his memory or to a printed key.
