ART. XII.—Bishop Nicolson's Diaries: Part VI. Edited by R. G. Collingwood.

Communicated at Carlisle, March 21st, 1933.

WILLIAM NICOLSON, bishop of Carlisle from 1702 to 1718\*, and a notable man in the ecclesiastical and political life of his day, but more especially in its intellectual life, as antiquary and historian, left behind him a number of MS. diaries which have been published in abridged form, edited by our then President, Bishop Ware, in these *Transactions*, N.S. i-v. The present paper forms a belated sequel to Bishop Ware's series, under circumstances to be described shortly.

The diaries of which Bishop Ware gave an account comprised, so far as I can make out from his papers, between thirty and forty volumes, partly of diaries proper, partly of almanacks, accounts and notes on botanical, archaeological, historical and theological matters. The diaries run from I January, 1683/4 to 3I December, 1725; but beside minor gaps and irregularities there are two large gaps: one of 15 months from 25 March, 1703 to 4 July, 1704 (N.S. ii, 195), the other of 2I months from 25 March, 1709 to 3I December, 1710 (N.S. iv, 45). In each case the suspicion might naturally arise that a volume of the diary had been lost.

The MSS. in question had descended through Elizabeth, third daughter of the bishop, who married the Rev. Bellingham Mauleverer, rector of Maghera, co. Derry, to the Lindesay family of Loughry, co. Tyrone: John Lindesay having married the bishop's grand-daughter Elizabeth Mauleverer in 1743 (N.S. i, p. 1, note). But it now appears that some part of the bishop's Diaries were separated from this main collection. Some time ago, Mr. Nicholas Mansergh, of Tipperary, at that time an undergraduate of Pembroke College, Oxford, and since then the author of a book on the Irish Free State, brought to my rooms at Pembroke a small MS, volume which he had found in his family library and which, he thought, might be of interest to me in view of my connexion with the diocese of Carlisle. This volume was Bishop Nicolson's diary for the period 25 March, 1709—31 December, 1710, the second of the two major gaps mentioned above. Mr. Mansergh could obtain no information as to how it had come into the possession of his family: but he entrusted it to my care for transcription and study, and after copying out the whole (this was done by myself down to 13 June, 1709, the rest by my secretary, Miss K. E. N. Munro), exhibiting it to the Society, and sending it for examination to Mr. T. H. B. Graham and Mr. R. C. Bosanquet, to both of whom I am indebted for calling my attention to points of interest and interpreting various allusions and statements, I have returned it to his hands.

Bishop Ware's papers comprised only selections from the text of the diaries, chosen for their special interest. In view of the bulk of material in his hands, this method of publication was inevitable; but, encouraged by assurance from our Editor that room can be found in the present volume, I here print the new diary practically in full,\* together with some notes, for many of which I am

indebted to Mr. Bosanquet; a thorough commentary would be a task beyond my powers, as well as very bulky and of little utility.

The MS. is a tall, narrow book,  $6\frac{3}{4}$  by 3 inches, bound in green vellum and containing 92 leaves. Inside the cover is a brief note in a nineteenth-century hand giving a few facts about the Bishop's life; on the first leaf, facing this, another note in the same or a similar hand beginning "Bishop Nicholson's Diary" and giving even fewer facts; on the same leaf, two pencil notes: Bp. Nicolson's (of Carlisle) Diary, and "Mr. B." is Mr. Benson, the bishop's son-in-law. The verso of this folio and the whole of the next folio are blank; the MS. begins on fo. 3 with the date 1709, Mar. 25. Friday, and ends on the verso of fo. 89, on 31 December, 1710, the last three folios being blank.

A brief summary of the contents may be of interest.

From 25 March to 28 April, 1709 the bishop is in London, attending parliament, where the chief matter under discussion is the union with Scotland, paying and receiving visits from relatives, friends, and men of note, and collecting scientific and antiquarian information.

From 29 April to 10 May, 1709, he is travelling by Biggleswade, Stamford, Barnby Moor, Tadcaster, Bolton, Leeds, Settle, Oxenholme and Penrith to Rose Castle.

From II May, 1709 to 27 November, 1710 he is at home; the diary gives brief notes on visits paid and received, diocesan business, and archaeological and other matters of interest (e.g. visit to Hadrian's Wall, 27 May, 1709; eclipse of the sun I February, 1709/IO; visit to Bowness-on-Solway, 14 March, 1710; to the Borrowdale plumbago mines, 4 July; to a Roman inscription at Cambeck Hill, 28 August).

From 28 November to 8 December he is travelling by Appleby, Greta Bridge, Boroughbridge, Ferrybridge, Barnby Moor, Stamford, Huntingdon and Buntingford, to London.

From 9 December, 1710 to the end of the year he is in London.
