ART. XIII.—Samian Ware from Watercrook. By Lt.-Colonel O. H. North, D.S.O., F.S.A.

 \mathbf{A}^{T} the same time that I found the Roman Altar described in these *Trans.* N.S. xliii, article VIII, I found some fragments of Samian ware.

Mr. E. J. Hilyard, B.A., F.S.A., classified the plain pieces as the base and rim of Form 18/31 and the base of a 37. He cannot date them exactly but thinks they are about mid 2nd century.



There was one fragment of decorated Dr. 37, showing the ovolo and the hind legs of an animal (fig. 1). This was submitted to Dr. F. Oswald, B.A., D.Sc., F.S.A., who has drawn and described it. He says the animal is a goat (Oswald 1842 or 1843) identical with 37 Colchester signed PATERN FE (Retro).

Bowl by Paternus of Leyoux A.D. 140-150 (his ovolo and he uses the same festoon circular beads below ovolo and rhomboidal beads in vertical rows).
