

NOTES ON SOME OF THE CONTRIBUTORS TO THIS VOLUME

ADDY, John. Graduated at the University of Leeds, where he later undertook research for the degrees of M.A. and Ph.D. He taught at one time at Darton High School, Barnsley, and has held a schoolmaster fellowship at Balliol College, Oxford. He is now a senior lecturer at the College of Ripon & York St John. His academic interests lie particularly in ecclesiastical history, and he is now engaged in research into the administration of the Diocese of Carlisle in the 17th and 18th centuries. He is the author of a number of books and papers.

BOON, George C., was born in 1927 and is a graduate of the University of Bristol. After some years at Reading Museum he became Assistant Keeper of Archaeology at the National Museum of Wales in 1957. He is chiefly known for his contributions to Romano-British archaeology and numismatics, being author of *Isca, the Roman Legionary Fortress at Caerleon, Mon.* (1972) and *Silchester: the Roman town of Calleva* (1974), as well as numerous specialised papers. Of late years he has developed a hankering for medieval and later records, and the paper printed in this volume combines that interest with his special numismatic study of counterfeit coinage.

HODGE, E. W., was born in Southport but has lived at Elterwater since 1936. He studied history at Oxford and also holds qualifications in Law. He is a Fellow of the Royal Society of Arts and of the Ancient Monuments Society. Has written extensively both on the Lake District and on other parts of the country.

OSBORN, Marijane, is an American married to an English Wordsworth scholar. In recent years she has taught at Lancaster University and has held Fellowships at the Institute for Advanced Studies in Humanities in Edinburgh and at The Queen's University of Belfast. An interest in sites of literary or archaeological significance is accompanied by an interest in pot-holing.

PERRIAM, Denis Robert. Born 1947, Carlisle. Member of staff of Carlisle Museum and Art Gallery since 1966. Assistant Secretary of the Carlisle Regional Group of CWAAS since 1967.

Member of the Visual Arts Panel of Northern Arts Association 1972-1975 and a member of the Display Panel of the Northern Federation of Museum and Art Galleries. Written articles for local press and 'The Connoisseur'. Lectured widely on local history. Was responsible for staging the exhibitions, 'Cumberland Artists 1700-1900'; 'The Nutter Family and Their Friends', 1972; 'Eighteenth Century Carlisle', 1973; 'The Landscape of Cumbria', 1974; and others.

TOMLIN, R. S. O., read Classics at Oxford. He has since lectured at Cornell University, the University of Kent, and the University of Durham, where he now teaches Roman History. He is writing a book on the late Roman emperor Valentinian I, and is joint assistant editor of *The Roman Inscriptions of Britain*.
