

ART. XV – *The Hawkshead School Library in 1788: A Catalogue*

THE young Wordsworth was, we are told, ‘one of the very few boys who used to read the old books in the School Library, George Sandys’ “Travels in the East” and his Ovid’s “Metamorphosis”, Fox’s “Book of Martyrs” and Evelyn’s “Forest Trees”’.<sup>1</sup> The library today is largely intact. In later years, Wordsworth and Coleridge made further use of the Hawkshead School Library, for on 29 July 1802 Coleridge wrote to Southey, then in Bristol, remarking that when he came to the Lakes, ‘You would have access to 4 or 5 Libraries’ including ‘the Library at Hawkshead School’.<sup>2</sup> If Coleridge was using the library at this time, Wordsworth probably was too.<sup>3</sup> A full account of the library as it stood during Wordsworth’s schooldays is thus of extraordinary interest to Romanticists.

Over the years a number of catalogues were made for the library. A seventeenth century catalogue can be found in the Cumbria Record Office, Kendal, among the Browne MSS. of Town End, Troutbeck (WD/TE/Bound Vol. VIII, 127–9). This is entitled ‘A Catalogue of Books given to the free Grammar Schoole of Hawkshead in Lanc[ashire] by Mr Daniell Rawlinson and others at his request’. A copy of this was contained in Daniel Rawlinson’s Account Book, once retained at the Grammar School but now lost. This version was published by Richard Copley Christie, ‘Old Church and School Libraries of Lancashire: Part II’, *Chetham Society Publications* vii (1885) 143–70, and agrees with the Browne MSS. In the catalogue that follows we quote from the latter.

The Rawlinson Account Book contained also catalogues of 1785 and 1788 – both now lost. However, these are partially retrievable because T.W. Thompson, who saw them in 1959, made a full copy of the 1788 catalogue, and copied selected entries from that of 1785. In addition, Christie gives a partial account of the 1788 catalogue, publishing titles of ‘some of the more interesting books’. Modern descriptions are provided for the surviving volumes, drawn from an inventory of the library prepared for the Hawkshead Grammar School Foundation in the 1960s by B. Berrecloth, A.L.A.

By collating these various sources, it is possible to reconstruct the contents of the Hawkshead School Library as it stood in 1788. We have organized our catalogue in alphabetical sequence by author. Each entry quotes the different versions of each title chronologically as it appears in the various lists; thus, our entry for Bacon’s *Opera Omnia* (Frankfurt, 1665) draws on the 1679, 1785, 1788, and Berrecloth lists:

Books occurring only in Berrecloth have not been included here, since they must have been added to the library after 1788. All those in either the 1785 or the 1788 catalogues

are included, together with corresponding entries for them in either Berrecloth or 1679. There are a small number of books that appear only in the 1679 catalogue; these are included here since they may nevertheless have been available to readers during the 1780s, though omitted from the catalogues compiled during that decade. We are confirmed in this notion by the fact that a number of books occur only in 1679 and Berrecloth – proof that a number of volumes from the old library were not included, perhaps deliberately, in the 1785 and 1788 catalogues. Books in either the 1785 or 1788 catalogues but no longer in the library have been marked NIL (not in the Library), and are placed in the alphabetical sequence suggested by their catalogue entries.

We wish to acknowledge the kind permission of John Gavin and the Trustees of the Armitt Library to publish from T.W. Thompson's notebooks, now at the Armitt Library, Ambleside; and of Jim Grisenthwaite and the staff of the Record Office, Kendal, for permission to publish from the seventeenth-century catalogue for the Hawkshead Grammar School Library, now at the Record Office, Kendal.
