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## THE GLAPWELL CHARTERS.

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## INTRODUCTION.

THE collection of about 250 documents here printed under the title "Glapwell Charters" was purchased in 1951 by the Derbyshire County Council and is in the custody of the County Librarian at Derby. The title is not strictly accurate, for the documents do not all belong to the same category and some do not relate to Glapwell. However, charters form the bulk of the collection which was preserved by generations of the Woolhouse and Hallowes families at Glapwell Hall. The collection was unknown to I. H. Jeayes who published in 1906 his valuable *Descriptive Catalogue of Derbyshire Charters in Public and Private Libraries and Muniment Rooms*. It was likewise unknown to Pym-Yeatman who in his *Feudal Derbyshire* assembled information from a variety of sources. The Glapwell Charters are a useful addition to the materials for the history of Derbyshire. To the editor of the cartulary of Darley Abbey<sup>1</sup> the chief interest of the collection lies in its inclusion of about thirty originals of documents in the cartulary, some of them endorsed "H", the section in which the transcripts of the documents relating to Glapwell were placed by the compilers. When compared with the originals, the copies in the cartulary prove to be, with one or two exceptions, accurate and creditable to the compilers who however frequently resorted to abridgment. The survival of both halves of the agreement, drawn up in the form of a cirograph, between the canons and their parishioners at Glapwell about 1250 (H 48 in the cartulary and nos. 140 and 141 in this collection) is unexpected. Several of the seals of the "lords and freemen of Glapwell" still hang from the portion intended for the canons, and each of the fifteen tags bears the name of the man or woman whose seal was attached to it. The writing is elegant and the cirograph, like so many other documents in the collection, is in an admirable state of preservation. The canons' seal attached to the parishioners' half of the cirograph is damaged, but very good impressions of the

seal and counterseal of the abbey are attached to another document of the same period (no. 148). There are documents relating to Darley abbey which were not transcribed into the cartulary, and a considerable number relating to the abbey of Beauchief. Most of the latter probably passed into the possession of the canons of Darley in the thirteenth century, since the canons of Beauchief found it convenient to hand over their properties in Glapwell to Darley abbey in return for an annual money payment.

The majority of the documents in the collection do not directly concern the two monasteries and though some of these are probably title deeds which passed to the canons when they acquired various properties, there is a residuum of thirteenth-century and a considerable bulk of later documents which appear to be family muniments. The Wolhouse family, whose association with the manor of Glapwell goes back at least to the late fifteenth century, preserved important documents — charters, indentures, marriage contracts and the like. This collection includes documents relating to Rotherham in Yorkshire where they were established in the late fourteenth century if not earlier, and neighbouring places. They went on preserving documents of various kinds in the fifteenth and sixteenth centuries, and there are good reasons for thinking that when they acquired Glapwell they took over an existing body of family muniments which had been accumulating in the thirteenth and fourteenth centuries. Many of these are connected with two men living in the early thirteenth century, Simon son of Hugh and Richard son of William, and their descendants and kinsmen, some of whom are discussed below. After the Reformation the members of the Woolhouse family preserved and added to their collection of papers. It is probably a safe inference from the documents numbered 223 and 224 that about 1556 John Wolhouse acquired from Sir Francis Leak of Sutton Scarsdale (whose kinsman of the same name was created Earl of Scarsdale in 1645) property which he had purchased in 1553 from Roger Grenhalgh of Tever-sall, part of which land had belonged to "the late dissolved monastery of Darley." It seems likely that the Darley

and Beauchief documents passed to John Wolhouse as a result of this transaction.

In his *Honors and Knights' Fees*<sup>2</sup> William Farrer traced the successive holders of Glapwell down to the early fourteenth century in his account of the Honor of Peverel of which it formed part (pp. 173-5). Serlo who held it of William Peverel in 1086 also held Ashover of another tenant-in-chief, Ralf fitz Hubert, and it is in the list of enfeoffments returned in his *carta* of 1166 by Hubert fitz Ralf, then holder of Ralf fitz Hubert's barony, that Serlo of Pleasley, presumed to be the direct descendant of the Domesday sub-tenant, makes his first appearance. The last reference to this Serlo which Farrer found belongs to 1180 and he seems to have died in or shortly before 1195. The relationship of Hugh whose sons, Simon, Robert and Roger, occur in the earliest documents in this collection, to Serlo of Pleasley cannot be established with certainty: it is more likely that he was Serlo's younger brother than his grandson. Though it seems unwise to try to establish the descent of almost all the holders of land in thirteenth-century Glapwell from Serlo of Pleasley, it is evident that many of the charters in this collection are grants by and to members of this family and yet more documents are witnessed by Serlo's descendants or kinsmen. To distinguish between successive generations is far from easy since there were two men named Simon son of Hugh.

Simon son of Hugh, living in the early thirteenth century, was the grantor of nos. 37 and 38 and the recipient of 39-40. His grants to the canons of Beauchief were made before 1217-18 (no. 147, H 47 in the cartulary). He witnesses a number of charters belonging to the early years of Henry III or earlier (nos. 11-17, 19, 20, 35, 78). He witnesses nos. 11-13 with his brothers Robert and Roger who are probably identical with Robert and Roger sons of Hugh who likewise had made grants to the canons of Beauchief before 1217-18 (no. 147). In no. 14 he witnesses with Roger the clerk his brother and in nos. 19-20 with Hugh, Ralf and Richard his sons. Simon's brother Roger (son of Hugh) is probably the grantor of no. 36 in which he refers to his brother Robert's

consent. There is no charter of Hugh, eldest son of Simon, but he may be identified as a witness (nos. 3, 4, 9, 10, 17, 19, 20 and ? 70). He died before 1250. Ralf of Glapwell, son of Simon and brother of Hugh, is the grantor of nos. 69, 70 and 75 (assigned to c. 1240) and is probably the Ralf who witnesses charters ranging from the earlier to the later years of Henry III (nos. 3, 4, 5, 9, 10, 18-20, 56, 78-81, 84-7, and possibly 140-41). Sarra of no. 126 may be his daughter. Richard son of Simon and brother of Hugh, occurs in nos. 19 and 20. He may be the recipient of nos. 59, 60 and 61, and possibly is to be identified with Richard the chaplain son of Simon, grantor of no. 74.

Simon son of Hugh (the younger) held the manor of Glapwell with William son of Richard in 1250 (Farrer, citing a Peverel survey of that year). Improbable as it may seem, the charters suggest that Simon of Glapwell who held half a fee there in 1293<sup>3</sup> is the same man. His earliest grants belong to the decade 1250-60 (nos. 41-3, 45-7), others to the 'sixties, 'seventies and 'eighties. In a charter of 1259-60 (no. 41) and another of 1282 (no. 54) he refers to the elder Simon, grantor of nos. 37 and 38, as his grandfather. These grants (nos. 41 and 54) are sealed with the same seal, one of three which this Simon employed. Though the corrupt legend on two of these three seals may explain why Simon had so many, both of the others are similarly found being used to authenticate documents which are a decade or two apart in date. The earlier Simon's seal, the design of which is a beast, probably a lion, differs from all three employed by his grandson. The younger Simon son of Hugh is described as lord of Glapwell in a document assignable to the end of Henry III's reign or later (no. 142). His attestations are innumerable and may suggest that he lived until shortly before 1300, but it is easy to make mistaken identifications when witnesses are being considered. He seems to be the man who acted as a surety in 1288 (no. 145). By 1302 he had been succeeded by his son Ralf who then held, with Roger de Somervill, a fee in Glapwell.<sup>3a</sup> If this Ralf is the

recipient of no. 72 dated 1292, his first wife was named Sybil. No. 135 dated 1312 mentions his wife Agnes who survived him and was living in 1339 (no. 180).

Avice, daughter of Hugh and sister of Simon son of Hugh, occurs in a considerable number of these charters which suggest that she was the sister of the younger Simon and not, as has been supposed, of the elder. She is called daughter of Hugh of Glapwell (no. 74 and no. 91) and sister of Simon son of Hugh (nos. 77 and 93). She refers in no. 93 to her mother Cecily who is described as widow of Hugh lord of Glapwell (no. 104) and in a document belonging to c. 1268 as mother of Simon son of Hugh (no. 44). Since William son of William de Grangia was Avice's uncle (no. 76), Cecily would appear to have been daughter of the elder William de Grangia. Another of Avice's uncles was Ralf son of Simon (no. 75) mentioned above. Her first marriage may be dated c. 1240 (nos. 75 and 76), and her first husband Roger son of William de Somerford occurs in a considerable number of the charters. The series numbered 82 to 89 shows that he was also called Roger of Bolsover. By this first marriage she had a son John (no. 92, etc.), who occurs frequently, and a daughter Cecily (no. 95). She later married Jordan of Glapwell (no. 98, etc.), who is also described as Jordan of Whitely (no. 142) and she survived him. In no. 97 she describes herself as widow of Roger de Derley who is not a third husband but Roger de Somerford under yet another name. This seems to be proved by the seals attached to nos. 101 and 102. The grantor of these charters is her son John son of Roger de Somerford but his seal is inscribed "sigillum Johannis filii Rogeri de Derley". Her daughter Agnes (no. 98) may have been the offspring of her marriage to Jordan. The grandson of Avice and Roger de Somerford occurs in no. 100 and styles himself John son of Richard of Darley. Since Roger de Somerford is also called "de Derley" this Richard is probably the younger son of Avice and Roger.

The younger Simon son of Hugh is called "lord of Glapwell" and his father Hugh likewise, and some evidence cited by Farrer seems to suggest that Simon held directly on the honour of Peverel. It is more likely that

they held of their kinsmen surnamed "de Reresbi" who derived their rights over Glapwell from Matilda, one of the co-heiresses of Serlo of Pleasley who died c. 1195. John de Aincurt promised 50 marks to have his wife's lands in Nottinghamshire and Derbyshire in 1195,<sup>4</sup> and in 1203 King John "confirmed to John de Aincurt and Ralf de Wiluigby and to Matilda and Beatrice their wives, heirs of Serlo de Plesseley, lands near Pledsley called Hill, now Baxterhill, Radmanthwaite and Moorhaigh, in accordance with the grant which he had made to the said Serlo when he was count of Mortain."<sup>5</sup> On the Pipe Roll for 1203<sup>6</sup> it is recorded that John de Aiencurt and Ralf de Wilegeby gave 25 marks and a palfrey "pro habenda terra que fuit Serlonis de Pleselleg' et confirmatione regis." In 1235-6<sup>7</sup> John de Aincurt is entered as holding a fee at Ashover which must have formed part of his wife's inheritance. There are specific references to his tenure of  $\frac{1}{2}$  fee at Glapwell on the Pipe Rolls of 1217 and 1224.<sup>8</sup> In nos. 9 and 10 of this collection he is styled a knight and he occurs also in nos. 12, 16, 17, 35-6, and 38-40. His wife who joins with him in granting the quit-claim numbered 39-40 is presumably Serlo of Pleasley's heiress. Since she is styled "de Belev" she is more likely to have been Serlo's granddaughter (as the other co-heiress Beatrice appears to have been) than his daughter as has been supposed.<sup>9</sup> According to the accepted genealogy, John de Aincurt's daughter and heiress married Isoreus de Reresby and their son Ralf of Rearsby was living as late as 1268. This is difficult to reconcile with entries relating to 1242-3 in the *Book of Fees*, where Ralf of Rearsby is returned as holding a knight's fee at Pleasley and other places<sup>10</sup> while Ralf son of Ralf of Rearsby holds of Hubert fitz Ralf's barony a knight's fee at Ashover.<sup>11</sup> It would be reasonable to suppose that the two entries relate to the same man, but if this is so,

the husband of John de Aincurt's daughter must have been named Ralf. If the accepted genealogy is right, John de Aincurt was succeeded between 1235 and 1242-3 by his great-grandson, which seems highly improbable. John de Aincurt who paid scutage in 1246 and contributed to the aid of 1254<sup>12</sup> appears to be a different person, the head of a senior branch of the family. Farrer writing of Ralf of Rearsby (whom he regards as son of Isoreus) says "he had been coroner of Derbyshire before 1275, but was then deceased, and is said to have sold his interest in Glapwell and Pleasley to Thomas de Bek consecrated bishop of St. David's in 1280." The document numbered no. 137 in this collection however shows that Ralf of Rearsby disposed of his rights in the manor of Glapwell to Ralf of Glapwell his tenant. This quitclaim is preserved only in late copies, which is unfortunate, for it is difficult to decide whether the document should be dated c. 1275 or 1311-12, a problem which would be solved by the script. The inference from the *Rotuli Hundredorum* that Ralf of Rearsby died in or before 1275 is borne out by charters of his widow Margery, one of which<sup>13</sup> is dated 1303 and another<sup>14</sup> is earlier than 1288-9 when William of Stainsby died. She occurs as Margaret widow of Ralf of Rearsby in the Pipe Roll of 1279.<sup>15</sup> Ralf appears to have been succeeded by his son Adam, a knight, who witnesses charters of 1323 and 1325<sup>16</sup> along with another Ralf of Rearsby. If the quitclaim was made by Margery's husband it must be assigned to a date prior to 1275 and the identity of Ralf of Glapwell the tenant remains uncertain. If on the other hand the note on the copy numbered 138 assigning the transaction to 1311-12 is correct, the grantor would appear to be a later Ralf of Rearsby and the grantees Ralf son of Simon who shared with Roger de Somervill a knight's fee in Glapwell in 1302. This later Ralf of Rearsby may be the man who with others had a fee at Ashover in 1302.<sup>17</sup> In 1326 Ashover was held of Roger Beler by Adam and

Ralf de Reresby.<sup>18</sup> The charters (nos. 136 and 136a) by which Ralf of Rearsby sold to the canons of Darley a bovate which he had purchased from John vicar of Scarcliffe and  $\frac{1}{2}$  bovate which he had bought from Alice daughter of Robert vicar of Heath probably belong to a date shortly before 1275 though the confirmation (no. 129) by Roger son of Adam of Glapwell, to whom a rent of 6d. was due from the  $\frac{1}{2}$  bovate, is dated 1281. The annual payment of 1d. due from the bovate to Thomas son of William of Glapwell was quitclaimed to the canons by Thomas whose charter (no. 29) is undated. Ralf of Rearsby who witnesses some of these charters may be identified with the man who was coroner 1268-9<sup>19</sup> and died c. 1275. One of the charters which he witnesses is dated 1271 (no. 51) while the others range from c. 1250 to c. 1260 (nos. 30, 41-2, 45). It is evident that the ancestor of the de Reresbi family, John de Aincurt, did not acquire with his wife Matilda the whole of Serlo of Pleasley's lands and rights in Glapwell. The descendants of the other co-heiress, Beatrice, who married Ralf de Willoughby, also had interests in Glapwell. Robert of Willoughby, lord of Pleasley, who confirmed to the canons of Darley the lands which they had in 1273 (no. 109) and 1274 (no. 110) pertaining to his "fee at Glapwell" may be the grandson of the above Ralf of Willoughby. Robert the grantor of no. 111 can be identified with the holder of many fees in Lincolnshire in 1242-3. His relationship to Ralf is uncertain.

It has been noted above that in 1283 Simon of Glapwell and Thomas Bek bishop of St. David's each had  $\frac{1}{2}$  knight's fee at Glapwell and that the bishop had not acquired his share from Ralf of Rearsby. Harl. Charter 52 G. 60 in the British Museum<sup>20</sup> which may be dated 1280-83 shows that he acquired it from Thomas son of William who occurs frequently in the charters in this collection. Most of his grants belong to the later years of Henry III or to the early years of Edward I. In H 68 in the cartulary of Darley abbey he describes himself as Thomas son of William son of Richard of Glapwell and

there is no doubt that he was the son of William son of Richard who in 1250 held, with Simon son of Hugh, according to a Peverel survey cited by Farrer, the manor of Glapwell then valued at 5 marks a year. The charters of William son of Richard in this collection (nos. 18, 20, 88) belong to the second quarter of the century and nos. 19 and 20 indicate that he succeeded his father before 1227. His father, Richard son of William, is represented by seven charters (nos. 11-17) and he witnesses nos. 35 and 36. All belong to the early thirteenth century and no. 147 shows that he granted land to the canons of Beauchief before 1217-18. The statement that the land which is the subject of his charter numbered 17 belonged to the fee of Hubert fitz Ralf may imply that it lay in or pertained to Ashover, though the fact that the list of witnesses terminates with "the whole vill of Glapwell" suggests that, whatever the tenurial position may have been, the land was located in Glapwell. The documents in this collection and the cartulary of Darley abbey throw no light on the ancestry of Richard son of William and there seem to be no satisfactory reasons for regarding his father William as the grandson or brother of Serlo of Pleasley who died c. 1195. There seems to be no way of connecting the document numbered 1, the preservation of which in this collection requires explanation, with the family to which Richard son of William belonged. Richard's wife was named Agnes (no. 19) but she can hardly be Agnes de Verdun who was to marry Robert son of William, since there is no reason to suppose that the marriage arranged in 1206 did not take place or that Robert died soon afterwards. Whether Richard son of William and his son and grandson held of the descendants of Serlo of Pleasley — either Rearsby or Willoughby — is uncertain. It is possible that Glapwell had been divided in the twelfth century, and that Richard son of William derived his rights from a descendant of the Domesday Serlo, other than Serlo of Pleasley who may not have had the whole manor of Glapwell.

Rights of lordship over the small village of Glapwell are complicated in the thirteenth century. It is probable that in the agreement between the abbot of Darley and

the *domini et liberi homines* of Glapwell (no. 140) which belongs to 1248-61, Simon son of Hugh and William son of Richard (holders of the manor in the Peverel survey of 1250) alone are *domini* and the rest are "freemen". In no. 142, which looks like an agreement between the chief landholders, in other words the "lords and free men" of that date, though they are not so termed, and the canons of Darley to permit an enclosure, Simon son of Hugh alone is described as "lord of Glapwell" though it seems likely that Thomas son of William (successor of William son of Richard) was also a "lord". These men however seem to have had lords other than the king. The statement in the *Rotuli Hundredorum*<sup>21</sup> that in 1276 the abbot of Darley had 5 bovates in Glapwell of the fee of Ralf de Derleye and his parcener who held in chief of the king is difficult to explain, since Ralf de Derleye does not occur in the cartulary or in this collection. He cannot be a Willoughby since 1276 falls within the lifetime of Robert of Willoughby. It is possible though unlikely that Ralf de Derleye is Ralf of Rearsby under another name. If Ralf of Rearsby's charter (no. 137) granting his own rights to his tenant Ralf of Glapwell belongs to c. 1275 and not 1311-12, it might be supposed that Ralf de Derleye of the Hundred Rolls is this Ralf of Glapwell, but such a solution raises more problems than it solves, and leaves unexplained Simon of Glapwell's tenure of half a fee in 1283 and 1293. Ralf de Derleye cannot be connected with William son of Richard one of the holders of Glapwell in 1250, for William was succeeded by his son Thomas, who granted the half fee which his family had held for many years to Thomas Bek. This half fee was held by Anthony Bek bishop of Durham in 1293.<sup>22</sup> The manor of Pleasley which he held of Robert of Rearsby is mentioned among the bishop's possessions at his death in 1311 but there is no reference to property in Glapwell. His heirs were Robert de Willoughby (then 50 and more) and John de Harcourt.<sup>23</sup> By 1303 a half fee which seems to be that

held by the Bek's had passed to Roger de Somervill who may be identified with the witness of that name who occurs in documents belonging to the earlier part of the reign of Edward I (nos. 23, 110, 129, 139). It may have been held of Roger de Somervill by Anthony Bek's heirs, for when Robert de Willoughby died early in 1317 he had  $\frac{1}{4}$  knight's fee at Glapwell held of Roger le Couper.<sup>24</sup> John de Harcourt presumably had the other quarter. This passage suggests that the successor or one of the successors of Roger de Somervill was Robert le Couper who granted land to Ralf son of Simon of Glapwell in 1298 (no. 73), and bought other land (no. 121). This Robert le Couper witnesses an undated charter of John son of Roger de Somerford (no. 101) and no. 160 may perhaps indicate that he died before June 1317. His widow is the grantor of no. 179, dated 1338.

Ralf (son of Simon son of Hugh) of Glapwell who with Roger de Somervill held a fee at Glapwell in 1303 had a son named Robert and another named Roger. Roger may be Roger of Glapwell who occurs in no. 183, dated 1340, and a number of Chesterfield charters<sup>24a</sup> ranging in date from 1314 to 1343. The documents numbered 160-65 in this collection are connected with Robert's purchase of land in Glapwell in 1329, while nos. 166-174 are mostly connected with his acquisitions in Staveley and Palterton 1329-35. The series 180-86 relates to some complicated transactions arising apparently from Robert's indebtedness. No. 180 shows that Agnes widow of Ralf (son of Simon son of Hugh) was alive in 1339 and reference is made to "her manor of Glapwell" which she was to give up and receive back for her lifetime with remainder to Robert and his wife Elizabeth and their offspring. It seems that Robert either at this time or earlier must have granted to his brother Roger all his lands in Glapwell, for Roger is found granting (no. 184) to Robert and Elizabeth rents amounting to 40 marks annually, a surprisingly large sum, from tenements in Glapwell and Rowthorn with which Robert had enfeoffed him. Roger also grants (no. 185) his manor of Glapwell and lands,

among which are Robert's recent purchases (nos. 163-5), to Robert and Elizabeth. These documents are dated 27th September and 1st October, 1340. Robert was one of the collectors of fifteenths and tenths in Derbyshire in 1344.<sup>25</sup> He is returned as holder of half a fee in Glapwell (which formerly belonged to Ralf of Glapwell) in 1346 by which time Roger de Somervill was dead and the other half fee was held by his heirs.<sup>26</sup> He is stated to have had 4 marks' worth of land in Glapwell in 1347.<sup>27</sup> No. 187 shows that he had in 1344 three children, Roger, Thomas and Elizabeth, and no. 193 may possibly indicate that he was alive in 1365 and had another daughter, Margaret, perhaps born to him in later life.

The documents relating to the 14th and 15th centuries do not make it possible to identify Robert's descendants or trace the successive holders of the manor or manors of Glapwell with certainty. Roger of Glapwell who occurs in no. 197 dated 1389 may be Robert's eldest son and may be identified with Roger of Glapwell who acted as one of the collectors of fifteenths and tenths in 1380 and 1384.<sup>28</sup> Ralf of Glapwell (also called Ralf Glapwell of Glapwell) who occurs in nos. 203, 205, 208 and 209, ranging from 1416 to 1440, seems to be in possession of the inheritance. He may be identified with Ralf Glapwell of Glapwell who was one of the collectors of fifteenths and tenths in 1419 and 1432.<sup>29</sup> In 1431 this same Ralf Glapwell of Glapwell "gentleman" is returned as the holder of a free tenement worth 13s. 4d. a year held by socage tenure.<sup>30</sup> An indenture dated 1439 (no. 207) is witnessed by Ralf Glapwell of Glapwell "gentleman", Thomas Glapwell rector of North Wingfield and William Glapwell rector of Heath. The last of the three witnesses is probably identical with William Glapwell "parson of Heath" to whom's Ralf's lands appear to have passed. In 1481 this William Glapwell made an arrangement whereby all this property in Glapwell and elsewhere in

Derbyshire should on his death pass to his cousin William Wolhouse the elder and thereafter to William Wolhouse the younger and his heirs (no. 212). This is the earliest document in the collection in which the Wolhouse family is connected with Glapwell, and it would be natural to infer that it explains how the Wolhouses came into possession of their property at Glapwell but for the statements in Lysons' *Magna Britannia*<sup>31</sup> that the family was settled at Glapwell before 1400 (p. clii) and that William Wolhouse died seized of it in 1411 (p. 56). These statements are difficult to reconcile with the information given above concerning Roger and Ralf of Glapwell, and there is no reference to a William Wolhouse as holder of Glapwell under 12 and 13 Henry IV in the *Calendar of Inquisitions Post Mortem* (1806-28), nor is there any reference to him in the *Calendar of Inquisitions Miscellaneous* or in the materials brought together in Pym-Yeatman's *Feudal Derbyshire*. On the showing of the documents in this collection, the Wolhouses were established at Glapwell from the late fifteenth century until the late seventeenth century. No. 215 may indicate that William Wolhouse the younger inherited the property in 1496.

From the document numbered 216 whereby the marriage of John Wolhouse, grandson and heir of William Wolhouse the younger, was arranged in 1498, it is evident that William Wolhouse had property not only in Glapwell but also in Rotherham, Mexborough and Dalby in Yorkshire. The family had then been connected with Rotherham for over a century. In 1391 William Wolhouse purchased for the relatively large sum of 120 marks some messuages at Rotherham (no. 244) and since he is described as "of Rotherham" the family was probably already well established there. William Wolhouse who attests a charter dated at Rotherham in 1411<sup>32</sup> is probably this same William Wolhouse, who also acquired another messuage in that town in 1411 (no. 246). The reference to him as "senior" in no. 246 raises the presumption that he had a son also called William Wolhouse, but it would be rash to identify the younger man

with William Glapwell's cousin, the beneficiary under the arrangement of 1481. John Wolhouse (grandson of the younger William Wolhouse of 1481) whose marriage was arranged in 1498 may well be the "gentleman" of that name who died in 1543 (no. 219) to whom succeeded another John Wolhouse who, as noted above, appears to have acquired some of the property of Darley Abbey in the reign of Mary and to have lived on into the reign of Elizabeth. D. and S. Lysons are rather vague concerning the date of the marriage between the heiress of the Wolhouses and a member of the Hallowes family. They state (p. 56) that "the heiress of Wolhouse about the middle of the seventeenth century married the ancestor of Thomas Hallowes, Esq., the present proprietor who resides at Glapwell-hall" (i.e. in 1817), and they comment (p. lxxxvi) that "Samuel Hallowes of Dethick married the heiress of Woolhouse of Glapwell about the middle of the seventeenth century", but elsewhere (p. clii) they say "the heiress of Thomas Woolhouse about the latter end of the seventeenth century married Hallowes". This Thomas Woolhouse is presumably the person to whom the receipt numbered 229 is made out. It is dated 1685 and is the latest document in the collection.

In some respects the original plan of this edition has been modified while it has been in preparation. The inclusion of photographic reproductions of a large number of the earlier documents has proved to be too expensive. Further, to save expense, documents printed in the edition of the cartulary of Darley abbey have not been printed again in full but references to section H of that work have been given and variant readings have been noted. The summaries in English are usually very brief and particulars concerning the documents themselves have been reduced to a minimum. Measurements and most endorsements have been given and the seals are described very briefly. Numbers and other marks, mostly in hands of the eighteenth century, occur on the dorse of many of the documents, but since their significance is not as a rule apparent, they have not been printed with the endorsements. To save space, place-names have not been identified in footnotes as was originally intended; a few

identifications are given in the summaries and for the others the reader is referred to the Index. The punctuation of the manuscripts and the scribes' use of capitals have not been consistently followed. "Et" has been printed in full throughout. The letters v and u are printed as in the MSS. except where initial u is written as v (e.g. vbi and Vniuersis, printed as ubi and Uniuersis). Contractions, except the terminations of place-names, have generally been extended. Erroneous readings are printed as in the MSS., generally with *sic* in brackets. No significance attaches to the order in which the documents are printed in this edition. The contents of the collection had been numbered for the Register of National Archives before they reached the editor, and though the arrangement might perhaps be improved in some respects, it seemed desirable not to rearrange the collection.

## THE GLAPWELL CHARTERS.

No. 1. Agreement between Nicholas de Verdun and Robert son of William made in the presence of Roger de Lascy, Constable of Chester, at Portsmouth, by which Nicholas gave to Robert in free marriage with Agnes his sister 110 shillings' worth of land and 1 pound of pepper, i.e. 105 shillings' worth of land in Tugby (co. Leic.) and Halstead (co. Leic.) and 5 shillings' worth in Skeffington (co. Leic.). Robert shall have seisin of all his lands and the homage and fealty of his men and Nicholas shall have all the rents and issues of the whole of Robert's land for 2 years from Michaelmas ensuing or 3 years if Robert so wishes, and Nicholas shall find reasonable necessities for Robert and Agnes and restock Robert's demesne lands with ploughs. Nicholas shall also make Robert a knight or find the cost of having him knighted. Robert, having no seal of his own, has used the seal of Roger de Lascy the Constable of Chester to confirm this agreement.<sup>1</sup>

Roger became hereditary constable and succeeded to the constable's barony when his father, John the constable, died at Tyre in 1190. At this date the vast lands of the Lacy family including the honour of Pontefract (Yorkshire) and the honour of Clitheroe (Lancashire) were possessed by Robert de Lacy the last of the descendants, in the male line, of the Domesday baron Ilbert de Lacy. When Robert de Lacy died childless in 1193 his heiress was Albreda de Lisours, mother of John the constable by the first of her three husbands. By the terms of a final concord made in the king's court on 21 April 1194 (Farrer, *Early Yorkshire Charters*, iii, 208, no. 1522), she handed all the Lacy estates to her grandson Roger the constable who assumed the surname "de Lacy" and was the first to hold the constablership of Chester along with the Lacy fief of which he seems to have taken possession in 1195. On the Lacy family and the history of their fees, see Farrer, *Early Yorkshire Charters*, iii, 199; *Complete Peerage*, vii, 677; Farrer, *Vict. Co. Hist. Lanc.*, i, 297 seq.

The above agreement was made on 21 May 1206, since William of Blois, bishop of Lincoln, died on 10 May of that year (*Flores Historiarum Rogeri de Wendover*, an. 1206). Roger of Wendover (ed. Hewlett, ii, 13) records that "Eodem anno (1206) rex Anglorum Johannes in hebdomada Pentecostes exercitum grandem apud Portesmuthe congregavit" and Roger de Lacy must have been at Portsmouth ready to participate in the expedition to Poitou when this agreement was made in his presence. Whether either of the parties was his tenant is uncertain, but the lands involved did not belong to any of his fees. Tugby

(6 carucates), Skeffington (12 carucates) and Halstead (3 carucates less 2 bovates) were reckoned as sokeland of Rothley in 1086 and formed part of the royal demesne (*Vict. Co. Hist. Leic.*, i, 307). By c. 1130 when the *Leicestershire Survey* was compiled, Tugby, Halstead and part of Skeffington (8½ carucates) had been granted to Norman de Verdon (Round, *Feudal England*, 198, *Vict. Co. Hist. Leic.*, i, 345, C. F. Slade, *Leicestershire Survey*, 14, 15, 24) ancestor of Nicholas de Verdon. When Thomas his elder brother died in 1199 (Chronicle of Croxden, *Monasticon*, v, 661), Nicholas seems to have succeeded to the English lands of their father Bertram de Verdon (on whom see *Dict. Nat. Biog.*). From the Pipe Rolls it appears that Thomas de Verdon was alive in 1198-9 (*Pipe Roll 10 Richard I*, 121, *1 John*, 166), and was dead in 1199-1200, in which year Gerard de Camville offered the king £1,000 to have his widow as wife for his son (*Pipe Roll 2 John*, 87). There is no record on the Pipe Rolls of these years of the payment of a relief by Nicholas de Verdon but by 1204, when he offered 100 marks to have the lands in Ireland which had belonged to his father (*Pipe Roll 6 John*, 227, 229), he was certainly in possession of his brother's inheritance, since in that year he also made an agreement with Thomas's widow and her second husband concerning her dower. Dugdale in his account of the Verdons (*Baronage*, i, 471 seq.) does not mention Agnes sister of Nicholas. Their father Bertram died in 1192 and she must have been at least 14 years of age at the time when the above agreement was made.

Robert son of William, to whom Agnes was given in marriage, is probably to be identified with that Robertus filius Willelmi who in 1216 paid to the King 50 marks "pro habendis gratia et benevolencia domini regis et saisina omnium terrarum suarum". The sheriff of Nottinghamshire and Derbyshire was ordered to give Robert seisin of all his lands in his bailliwick as soon as Robert had given security for the payment of that sum and to inform the sheriff of Leicestershire who should give Robert seisin of "Wimeswould and Tugby with all his lands in his bailliwick" (*Rot. de Oblatis et Finibus*, ed. Hardy, 591). Since Robert had no seal when the above agreement was made and was to be knighted at some future date, he was probably a minor, and if the entry in the Fine Roll refers to a payment made when he came of age, he must have been about 11 years old in 1206.

Of the witnesses, Thomas the dispenser and Hugh his brother (also a dispenser) are found elsewhere as witnesses and in association with Roger de Lacy, and their family, like that of Robert FitzWilliam, had property at Loughborough and Burton on the Wolds. Hugh the dispenser succeeded to the inheritance on the death of his brother, Thomas the dispenser, in 1218 (Farrer, *Honors and Knights' Fees*, ii, 58-9, and *Early Yorkshire Charters*, iii, 213-4). Farrer states that "in 1206 the king gave to Hugh

Despenser Isabel wife of Geoffrey de Cestria lately deceased, together with her inheritance but the lady privily married someone else (*ibid.* citing *Close Rolls*, i, 74, 84b and *Rot. de Finibus*, 398 seq.) and this Geoffrey de Cestria may be Galfridus Cestr', the first witness to the agreement. R. decanus de Marn' was evidently (rural) dean of Marnham, co. Notts. In *Hist. MSS. Comm. Rep. on the MSS. of Lord Middleton at Wollaton Hall* (10-11) is printed a charter of c. 1175 whereby John the Constable of Chester (Roger de Lacy's father) confirmed a grant to Nicholas the clerk of Marnham (co. Notts.). It is possible that R. dean of Marnham is to be identified with Robert brother of Nicholas (of Marnham) who appears among the witnesses. Several persons with whom William de Charnelles and Robert de Chaumpaigne might possibly be identified occur in records of the late 12th and early 13th centuries. A charter of William Bassett, presumably the founder of the line of Bassets of Sapcote in Leicestershire (on whom see Dugdale, *Baronage*, i, 382) concerning a mill at Potters Marston is witnessed by, among others, William de Charnell (printed in Nichols, *Hist. and Antiq. of Leicestershire*, iv, pt. ii, 489 from a Coventry cartulary). In 1225 a certain William Charnelles was "appointed in Leicestershire for the perambulation of the forests" (Farrer, *Honors and Knights' Fees*, ii, 320). Richard de Garsal' presumably derived his surname from Garshall in Staffordshire.

*No. 2. Agreement between John de Oreby<sup>1</sup> and Richard de Sumerville concerning the partitioning of the wood of Blackwell between them: each is at liberty to assart and cultivate his share. Early Henry III.*

Roger de Aincurt (*ibid.*, 981) held of Oliver de Aincurt a fee in Morton (co. Derb.) close to Blackwell, Geoffrey Barre (*ibid.*, 977) held fees in Nottinghamshire and elsewhere, and William of Bilsby held land of the Earl of Ferrers at Bilsby in Lincolnshire, and other fees (*ibid.*, 1002, 1058-9, 1085, 1091). At this date Roger de Sumerville held a knight's fee at Blackwell (*ibid.*, 976, 998). From this information it would appear that the above agreement is earlier than 1242-3, and the handwriting suggests a date much nearer to 1200 than 1250.

**No. 3.** Grant<sup>1</sup> by Robert son of Robert of Glapwell to the canons of Darley of 1 acre in Glapwell, for which the canons gave him 8s. *Early Henry III.*

The handwriting of no. 22 is clearly that of another scribe. The canons had two charters, nos. 22 and 26, written by different scribes and having different witnesses but granting the same land and both sealed with Thomas's seal.

At the end of the term, all of this land shall return to Simon, except 6 acres which he gave them at the beginning of the agreement. 24 June 1271.

**No. 145.** Agreement by which Abbot William and the canons of Darley granted to Geoffrey de Grangiis, chaplain, all tithes of corn, hay, wool, lambs and other small tithes and the oblations pertaining to their chapel of Glapwell and the toft pertaining to the chaplain of the said chapel, and another toft with a croft, etc., for a term of 5 years beginning at Michaelmas 1289, saving to the canons the principal mortuary in live animals, land and growing corn, and all the greater tithes from their ploughed land and herds in Glapwell. Geoffrey shall render annually to the canons 45*s.* and 2*d.*, discharge synodal dues and Lenten dues *i.e.*, 18*d.* annually, and shall serve the chapel in person with a suitable clerk and maintain the buildings in the said tofts and if he constructs new buildings there he must not remove them at the end of this term. For the observance of this agreement Geoffrey found pledges, *i.e.*, Simon son of Hugh of Glapwell and Richard de Grangiis. *11 November 1288.*

It seems that the farm was reduced from 24s. to 22s. and 6d. at some date between 1217-18 and 1275-87 (see no. 149), and that the compiler of the cartulary has altered the farm in no. 147 to bring it into line with no. 149.
