### *Small Finds Archive Catalogue.*

#### **Whetstones**

6 small whetstones were recovered presumably associated with the finishing of needles or hooks and dating from the middle of the nineteenth century and later.

Contexts: unstrat x 1, 2201 x 2, 2217 x 1, 2220 x 1, 2224 x 1.

The typical shape is cylindrical with a length of ##mm, slightly barrel shaped with a central diameter of ##mm and end diameters of ##mm.

Their use in the needle industry is attested by **obtain reference**.

#### **Knife Handles**

2 knife handles were recovered, both from context no. 2221

The first consists of a single bone plate which was held in place on the knife tang by three iron rivets.

The second consists of a bone tube into which the knife tang would have been inserted. The tang remains *in situ*.

Note: The majority of the finds come from Area IA and are of Phase V consequently they are generally associated with the occupation of Building F202.
