It is situated in a ploughed land called 'Mill-field', where was the double circle of the 'sanctuary', which was enclosed in 1685, as we learn from the curious letter of Dr Tope of Marlborough. 41,cxxxiii, (1920), 189, Lockeridge & Hospitallers; L B Larking & J M Kemble 'The Knights Hospitallers in England', 1857, p187. Actual deed in The Malta 1338 Return

42, cxxxvii, (1922), 49-51 Passmore's notes on work in n wilts; 52-63, Crawford' work in N wilts

42, cxl, (1924), 427-9, 'The Wiltshire Lichens in the Dept of Botany at the british Museum', Cecil P Hurst; lichens, eg *Physica fusca*, found on sarsens in Valley of Stones, v inland for a mainly maritime species, rare *Parmelia prolixa*, var. *isidiascens* on stones in Fifield

42, cxl, (1924), 497-500, Albany Major's excavs of Wansd at New Buildings

43, cxlii, (1925), 140, Roman coin given to Devizes Mus, found by CEPonting, in Stanley Copse, Lockeridge (same entry again in 43, cxliii (1926), 251, same or were there two?)

44, cxlviii, 1928, 104, 'Pre-Roman Coffin Burials'; RCC Clay 101-5, 'Overton, West. Barrow 1. Skeleton in wooden coffin with bronze knife-dagger, crutched pin and flanged celt' ref; Arch XLIII, 121 & Ant of N Wilts, 167, xi, H, vi, k

44, cxlviii, 99, 'Polished Flint Knives', RCC Clay. 'The rectangular knife found at Overton, Wilts, beneath the roots of an ash tree on Pick Ridge Farm, and now in the Blackmore Museum, Salisbury, was definitely associated with a large barbed and tanged flint arrowhead. This might possibly be of early Bronze Age date'.
