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

Hare, J N. 1995, 'Agriculture and Land Use on the Manor of Overton 1248-1539'; (unpublished paper).

This essay was commissioned for the FYFOD project in April 1995. John Hare was asked to complete a thorough examination of as many documents as possible, especially those in the archives at Winchester cathedral, relating to the manor of East Overton and Fyfield, with particular emphasis on place-names, specifically Raddon'. In addition, his brief was also to consider the manorial economy of East Overton and Fyfield in the medieval <u>and later medieval periods</u>. The documentary search was carried out by <u>Hare's friend</u>, Edward Roberts, with the final text written by <u>Hare</u>.

Straton C R (ed). 1909, Survey of the Lands of William First Earl of Pembroke. vol i. Roxburghe Club: Oxford.

This Survey is referred to in the text as the '1567 Survey', 'the Survey of 1567' or sometimes simply as 'the Survey'. <u>The dating of this survey comes from VCH Wilts, vol xi, though it is evident</u> others, such as John Hare, EGH Kempson, believe it to have been carried out in 1562. It covered each of the manors which the First Earl of Pembroke obtained after the Dissolution, including East <u>Overton and Fyfield</u>. For each entry, the manorial holdings, the names of tenants, their holdings and how these are held, and to a varying extent the boundaries of pasture and woodland, are detailed, offering the historian a great deal of material.

Deleted: To be precise the entry for West Overton was carried out in 1566 and that for East Overton and Fyfield in 1567 (*WAM* 32, xcviii, 291-2)

Yarrow S. 1995, Lockeridge, the Knights Templar and Rockley. Unpublished essay. FYFOD: Newcastle University.

Simon Yarrow's work on the Templars at Rockley and the history of their holdings in Lockeridge was commissioned by the FYFOD project in May 1995. Yarrow's brief was to transcribe any leases or donations of land at Lockeridge to the Knights Templar at Rockley into modern English. In addition he was asked to produce a brief history of Lockeridge, Fyfield Down and Rockley during the time of the Knights Templar, noting any pieces of information which were potentially relevant to the FYFOD project. His final report is archived as Working Paper 18 (WP18).

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Cartographic sources

Andrews' & Dury's Map of Wiltshire, 1773. (Reproduced by the Wiltshire Archaeological Society, Devizes, 1952). Plates 11 & 14. Referred to as 'A&D' or 'A&D map' in the text. The Manors of East Overton, Lockeridge in Overton, Fyfield and Clatford in Preshute. WRO/Open-access.

Late 18th century. Referred to as 'late C18 map' in the text.

West Overton in the County of Wilts, 1783. WRO/2203.

Two versions of this map exist, one, a 'rougher' version dated 1783, the other 1794. These are referred to as '1783 map' and '1794 map'.

A Plan of the Manor of West Overton in the County of Wilts, 1802. WRO/EA61.

Referred to as '1802 map'. This map was based on the previous two maps of West Overton (see above), and was no doubt carried out for the parliamenatry inclosure commissioners of West Overton (25 March 1802).

A Plan of an Estate belonging to The Rev.^d F. C. Fowle with the Lands adjoining comprehending the Manor of Fifield and East Overton in the County of Wilts. By A Dymock, 1811. WRO/628/49/4. Referred to as '1811 map'. The title is a little confusing as no part of the modern parish of East Overton appears on this map, apart from the tiny plot of 'Weylands'. As such this map is really delineating much of the boundary of the modern parish of Fyfield, though it does not of course include the late C19 additions of Clatford Park and Overton Heath.

A Map of East Overton. West Overton. Lockridge and Fifield, made in the Inclosure. 1815 and 1816. WRO/EA117.

Referred to as 'Inclosure map' or '1815/16 map'. Many of the details of the size of plots, land allotments and land exchanges are itemised in the margin of the map. A full report of the proceedings concerning this inclosure accompanies the map at WRO. Inclosure was not awarded to East Overton until 1821.

A Plan of East Overton, West Overton, Shaw, Lockeridge and Fifield in the County of Wilts. By Abraham Dymock, 1819. WRO/778/2.

Referred to as '1819 map'. Dymock would appear to have replaced Decimus Godson as surveyor and cartographer for the inclosue commissioners in East Overton and Fyfield. This multi-coloured map no doubt relied heavily on the previous maps of the area (especially WRO/628/49/4 & WRO/EA117), though is far more detailed, marking every gate and noting crops.
