1 NON TECHNICAL SUMMARY

- 1.1 This report presents the results of a watching brief undertaken by AOC Archaeology Group at a proposed residential development at Plots 7 & 8, Old Mill Place, Friockheim, Angus (NGR: NO 5935 9989). The work was commissioned by The Firm of Val Dawson and was designed to satisfy the requirements of the local planning authority who are advised on such matters by Aberdeenshire Council Archaeology Service, (ACAS). This work was in accordance with the principles inherent in NPPG 5 (SOEnd 1994) and PAN 42 (SOEnd 1994a).
- 1.2 Neither significant archaeological features nor artefacts were recorded.

2. INTRODUCTION

2.1 Project background

- 2.1.1 An archaeological watching brief was undertaken on behalf of The Firm of Val Dawson during ground-breaking works associated with the proposed residential development at Plots 7 & 8, Old Mill Place, Friockheim, Angus. Planning Application ref no: 07/00517/FUL.
- 2.1.2 The proposed development area lies within the administrative area of Angus Council, which is advised on archaeological matters by Aberdeen Council Archaeological Service (ACAS). The work required was in accordance with NPPG 5 (SOEnD 1994) and PAN 42 (SOEnD 1994a), in determining the nature, extent, condition, date and significance of any archaeological remains within the proposed development area.

2.2 Archaeological background

- 2.2.1 The proposed development lies within the site of an early 18th Century and later industrial complex, NMRS:NO54NE0047 (NGR:NO59264989), consisting of a Linen Mill, Bleachworks and Gasworks, the remains of which were recorded on a map as recently as 2006. This map showed that a range of single-storey slatted conditioning sheds, the reservoir and lade system, and some rubble and brick buildings survived.
- 2.2.2 In the wider area cropmarks of a number of features, including a block of Rig and Furrow NMRS No.NO54NE0023 (NGR:NO59174999) and a Palisaded Enclosure NMRS No.NO54SE0018 (NGR:NO58414020) have also been recorded by aerial photography.

2.3 Site location & geology

2.3.1 The proposed development lies within the village of Friockheim. It is bounded by modern residential developments to the east and south, gardens of modern




Figure 1:Site location

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residential developments to the west, and Lunan Water to the north. (Figure 1). The most recent use of the development area is that of a compound for the storage of building materials.

2.3.2 The underlying geology consists of old red sandstones, conglomerates and shales.

3. OBJECTIVES

- 3.1 The objectives of the archaeological works were to:
 - i) monitor ground-breaking works associated with the development and prevent the destruction of significant archaeological features prior to their recording;
 - *ii)* should significant archaeological material be discovered, the preparation of a mitigation strategy compliant with ACAS would be undertaken.

4. METHOD

- 4.1 The groundbreaking works consisted of two trenches each measuring 5 m by 3 m, which were located within the house plots of the proposed development. (Figure 1). Both of the trenches were excavated down in shallow spits, under archaeological supervision, down to the level of the natural geology. Trench 1 was orientated north/south and placed across Plot 7 whilst Trench 2 was orientated east/west was cut across Plot 8.
- 4.2 The groundbreaking works were undertaken using a mechanical excavator (JCB) using a 0.90 m wide toothed ditching bucket.
- 4.3 Black and white print and colour slide photographic record shots were taken of the excavated trenches.

5. RESULTS

- 5.1 The various data gathered from the evaluation are presented as a series of appendices:
 - *i)* Appendix 1: Trench Register;
 - *ii)* Appendix 2: The Photographic Register;
 - *iii*) Appendix 3: reproduces the Discovery & Excavation entry.
- 5.2 The fieldwork was undertaken on the 14th November 2007 under dry, bright weather conditions.

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5.3 A description of the nature of the deposits encountered can be found in Appendix 1.

6 CONCLUSION

6.1 No significant *in-situ* archaeological remains or artefacts were observed during the ground breaking works. The buildings recorded on the 2006 map have been previously demolished during earlier development works on the site, to the extent that no *in-situ* remains survive. No further archaeological works are considered necessary.


