

Excavations at Clickhimin (Shetland)

The practice of building circular stone towers or brochs as a defence against their enemies was widespread among the tribes of Northern Scotland in the Iron Age. The excavation of Clickhimin Broch has an important bearing on the study of early broch cultures in Scotland and its findings will be of considerable interest to archaeologists in Britain and overseas.
