

### **EXCAVATIONS**

End-December

Bow

THE excavation directed by Harvey Sheldon on behalf of London Museum was intended to provide information on the suggested route of the Roman road from London to Colchester. However, no evidence of this has been found, although the work has revealed a possible Romano-British settlement.

So far the evidence includes laid-pebble yards with associated dense animal bone deposits and also three ditches, one of which may be circular in plan. Coins and pottery indicate an intense 4th century occupation pre-dated by gravel pits and a ditch containing 1st to 2nd century material. Preliminary conclusions suggest that the site, only some three miles east of *Londinium*, was a farmstead.

Full time working during the week is expected to start towards the end of December for a period of a fortnight at least. All inquiries regarding this important site should be made to R. A. Canham, London Museum, Kensington Palace, W.8. (WES 9816).
