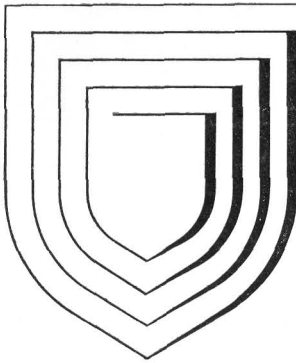

Courses in Archaeology & Local Studies 1970 - 71

Last year nearly one hundred courses in these and related studies were offered by the Department and were held in all parts of the London Region. This year's programme will be similar and will include part time evening lecture courses, residential and non-residential week-ends, and residential one-week courses.

A very wide range of subjects, from World Prehistory to Local Studies in the London region, is available through the Extension and Tutorial sections.

Among these courses are:

1. Those which lead through annual examinations to Extension Diplomas in Archaeology and History (Scheme C, Local History) or to a sessional certificate in Field Archaeology and the Archaeology of South Eastern England.
2. Those which, without examination, study and practise the techniques of excavation, field-surveying and environmental archaeology under professional archaeologists.
3. Those which offer accounts of the present state of research in particular fields. Of special interest this year will be the course on Recent Developments and Research in European Archaeology to which several leading archaeologists will contribute.

There are no entrance requirements, other than a willingness to study seriously under direction.
