### INNER LONDON (NORTH) ARCHAEOLOGICAL UNIT

Applications are invited for two posts of Archaeological Field Officer, to be employed in archaeological rescue work in Inner London, north of the Thames and outside the City. The two Officers will form the nucleus of an Archaeological Unit to be formed on behalf of seven Boroughs of Inner London. Appointments will be initially for one year, terminable by one month's notice on either side, but it is anticipated that they will become permanent. Contributory superannuation scheme.

1. **Senior Field Officer** in the scale £2,820-£3,165 plus £144 London Weighting, point of entry according to experience and qualifications. Should be a graduate with considerable experience in excavation, preferably under urban conditions, and in the preparation of archaeological reports. He will be required to take charge of the Unit, under the general supervision of the Chairman of the Research Committee, and will be responsible for the Unit to the Council of the Society or such other Committee as may be appointed for the purpose. Experience in leading and organising amateur groups will be an advantage.
2. **Field Officer**, in the scale £1,644-£2,820 plus £144 London Weighting, point of entry according to experience and qualifications. Preferably a graduate and should be sufficiently experienced to direct an excavation and report on it.
