# Letter

## A NEW SOURCE FOR ARCHAEOLOGISTS

I WONDER if any of the *London Archaeologist's* readers can be expected to discover Tai Liu's recent *Puritan London: A Study of Religion and Society in the City Parishes*, Newark: University of Delaware Press and London: Associated University Presses, 12.1986, 0-87413-283-5?

It is an uneven piece of social history, but among his appendices is a fifteen page tabulated breakdown of the estimates made by the London parish clergy in 1638 of the numbers of houses and the numbers of communicants across the city. These provide parish

by parish figures for population density for early Stuart London that should, clearly, be a useful reference tool for London's archaeologists. As this appendix is not even given a separate entry on Professor Liu's contents page, this information would not be apparent at first glance to this journal's readers.

Despite its cost, this is a book that can have a place in reference collections for London's archaeologists.
