
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

Exhibitions

Hand to the plough, at Bexley Museum, Hall Place, Bourne Road, Bexley until 28 October. An exhibition of farming in Bexley one-hundred years ago, to celebrate British Food and Farming Year. Some working demonstrations of farm equipment.

Chinese Bronzes: Art and Ritual, at the British Museum until 29 October. This exhibition, which includes some of the most important surviving Chinese bronzes, illustrates the history of the major types of bronzes from the collection in the British Museum, from the Shang (ϵ 1700 – 1050 BC) and Zhou (ϵ 1050 – 221 BC) dynasties. Ritual vessels form the major part of the exhibition, but other types, such as weapons and chariot fittings, are also included. The exhibition is accompanied by a catalogue, *Chinese Bronzes: Art and Ritual*, by Jessica Rawson (price £5.95), produced with support from the Sainsbury Centre for the Visual Arts and the Arthur M. Sackler Foundation.

Ambulances and Air Raids – the St John Ambulance and the Second World War, at the Museum of the Order of St John, St John's Gate, St John's Lane, EC1M 4DA until 22 December. Open Monday-Friday 10 – 5 p.m., Saturday 10 – 4 p.m., closed Sunday. Marking the 50th anniversary of the outbreak of the Second World War, this exhibition concentrates on the vital work of the St John Ambulance Brigade during the War.
