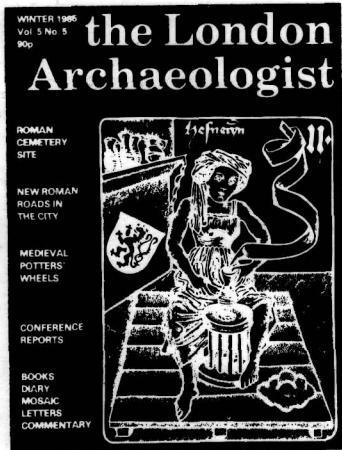

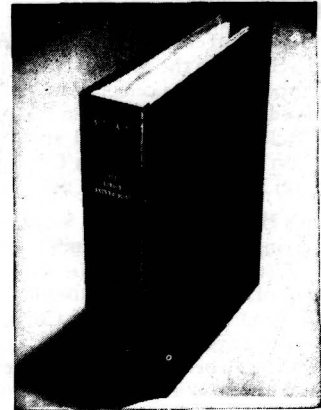

## Conferences

**Symposium of the Archaeological Research Committee of Surrey Archaeological Society**, Saturday 24 February at Dorking Christian Centre

**33rd Annual Conference of London Archaeologists**, Saturday 23 March 1996 in the Museum of London Lecture Theatre. The afternoon will be a celebration of the 50th anniversary of the Roman and Medieval London Excavation Council. Speakers will include John Shepherd and Gustav Milne.
