will be awarded to the best publication of 2008 or 2009. A second prize of £100 plus certificate will also be awarded if sufficient entries of high enough standard are received.

After co-sponsoring the highly successful London Archaeological Prize since its inception in 2004, London Archaeologist is picking up the reins from SCOLA (which has now disbanded) to continue to drive the prize into the future. We want to encourage the highest standards of writing about archaeology for all audiences – whether professional or amateur, the general public or children. Any type of publication is eligible – a book, a journal article, or proceedings from a conference, and it can be a professional, amateur or commercial publication. It must, however be in digital or printed form (not a broadcast, for instance).

A panel of judges appointed by London Archaeologist will be looking for quality and excellence, and will want to know how well the publication meets its aims.

NOMINATIONS MUST BE RECEIVED BY 21 MAY 2010.

Anyone, whether associated with the publication or not, may make a nomination.

- reason the publication is worthy of the prize (in 100 words)
