The City of London Archaeological Trust (CoLAT) announces the creation of the Rosemary Green Grant, arising from a bequest to the Trust by Miss Rosemary Green.

This is a one-off award of up to £80,000, payable over a period up to three years, for a single project. It is intended to foster a project that makes a major strategic impact on our understanding of the City of London's historic and prehistoric past through archaeological research. There is no specific geographical boundary to define the City's environs; however applicants must demonstrate a link between their project and the City.

Activities such as fieldwork (e.g. survey and excavation), artefactual, environmental and documentary research, post excavation analysis and publication all fall within the remit of the award. However the Trust emphasises that the award is intended to support a multi-disciplinary project that draws on varied sources of data from several sites and/ or assemblages and collections to produce new synthetic narratives of the past.

The successful project will need to demonstrate that it will deliver significant outcomes in the areas of interpretation, explanation and education. It will particularly need to show proven engagement with the general public and promotion of the wider values of archaeological work.
