Christchurch Harbour

Summary Description

Christchurch Harbour and bay is situated to the east of Poole Bay and overlooks the approaches to the Western Solent. The area is popular for watersports and recreation. The exposed Headland at Hengistbury is home to archaeological remains of national importance.

Sea Surface

The harbour is a popular site for marine recreation activities, most notably sailing, windsurfing, and water-skiing. The main North Channel of the harbour enters into the bay, and floating buoys mark the approach. A caution area is designated on the approach. An anchorage area exist outside the harbour entrance.

Seabed Surface

The harbour is formed from the rivers Stour and Avon. It has sand and gravel spits at the mouth, there are extensive mudflats and salt marshes within the harbour. It is a Special Area of Conservation (SAC) designated area. The upper parts of the river valleys have been reclaimed.

The harbour is located within a natural coastal bay. The character area stretches from Hengistbury Head eastwards to Hurst Point. The area incorporates six safe sandy beaches, Mudeford sandbank to Highcliffe. The coastline is characterised by sand and shingle. A variety of coastal defence structures continue into the marine zone such as rip rap and groynes.

The approach features Christchurch Ledge, a submerged navigation hazard.

The maritime archaeological resource features five recorded wreck sites, two of which are near shore and three are further seaward. The *Caroline Susan*, a British motor yacht sunk in 1940 is a recognised dive site.

Seabed Subsurface

While no further features are recorded, it should be highlighted that recent research into the development of the Solent and English Channel is beginning to reveal evidence for the potential for survival of submerged prehistoric landscape deposits within the seabed from times of lower sea level.

Coastal

The most significant archaeological area is Hengistbury Head. Here evidence of prehistoric cultural activity can be traced from the Upper Palaeolithic period to the Iron Age and displays a wealth and diversity of remains. These remains are situated on and around this prominent headland.

Settlements in the area include Christchurch which dates from Saxon times and lies in the shadow of the magnificent 11th century Priory Church and still retains its Saxon street layout. Mudeford is a small village from where a ferry across the Avon embarks.

Popular coastal areas include Avon Beach, Highcliffe, Barton on Sea, Hordle Beach and Milford on Sea.

Wildlife and conservation features includes coastal grazing and heathland and a nature reserve.











Archaeological Potential

The archaeological remains at Hengistbury Head demonstrate the wealth of prehistoric occupation evidence and the exploitation of the marine zone. Further evidence of submerged prehistoric landscapes should be expected within Christchurch Harbour.

Offshore the archaeology of this area is dominated by the rich shipwreck resource. However, the potential to encounter further traces of drowned landscape features within the seabed should not be discounted. The potential to encounter the remains of crashed aircraft must also be considered, particularly as there is document evidence of a WWII aircraft crash in the area.
