








A. N. porch of St. Lawrence's, Bradford-on-Avon, Wilts.




'HOLDFAST', UPTON-ON-SEVERN, WORCS. (PP. 142, 144)




DRAYTON, OXON. (p. 142)




WARRINGTON, LANCS. (p. 142)






POST-ROMANESQUE ROOFS, 1230-60





CROWN-POSTS




DETAILS OF CROWN-POSTS OF PHASES II AND III


TIE-BEAM AND CROWN-POST ARRANGEMENTS

- D. Later hall, c. 1350
















