









THE BREAC MOEDDOIC BUDGET. Sc. c.  $\frac{1}{3}$








- A. View of the *Pfingstberg* from NW., during a wet period in 1961, to show the former lake (p. 85)























C. W. side of inserted partition in truss B, Barrow Hill House, showing clean face, which contrasts with smoke-blackened collars and rafters over former open hall












BRISHING COURT, NEAR MAIDSTONE, KENT
















