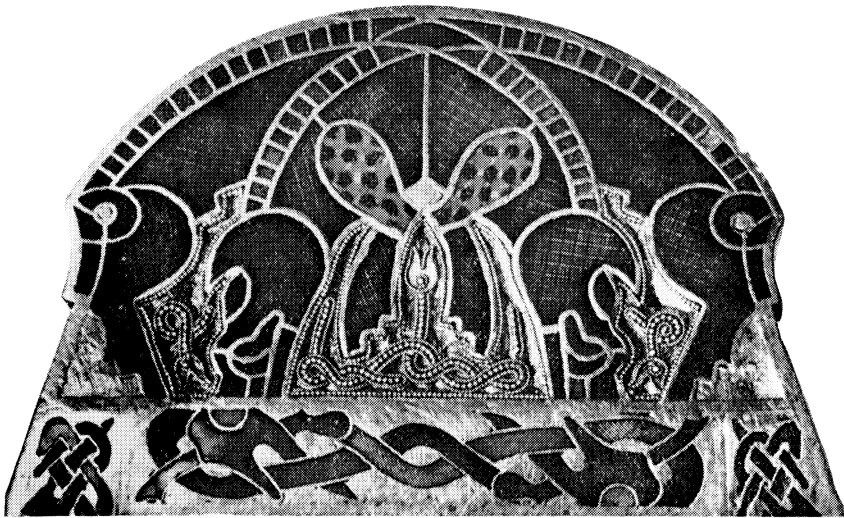

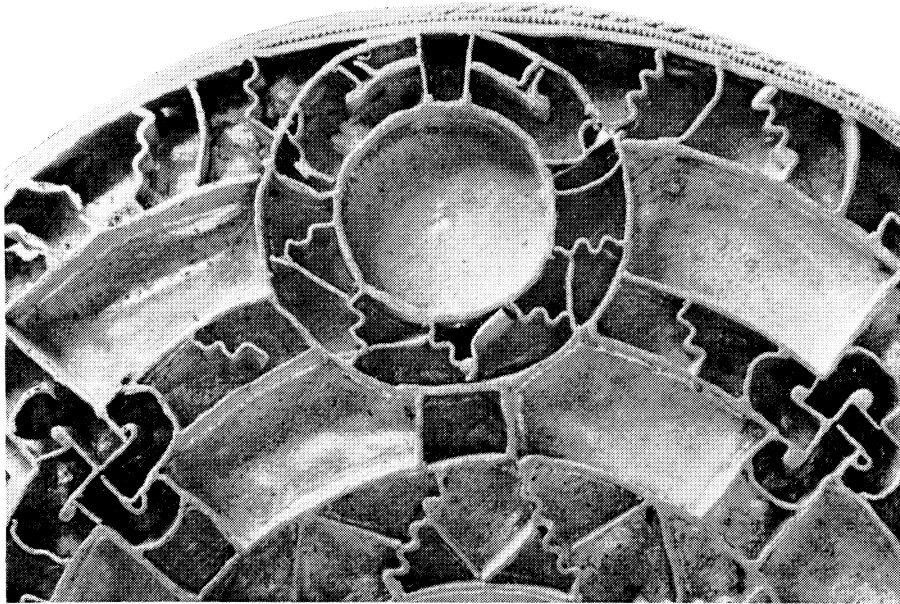

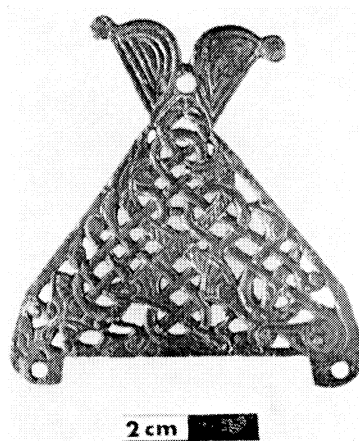

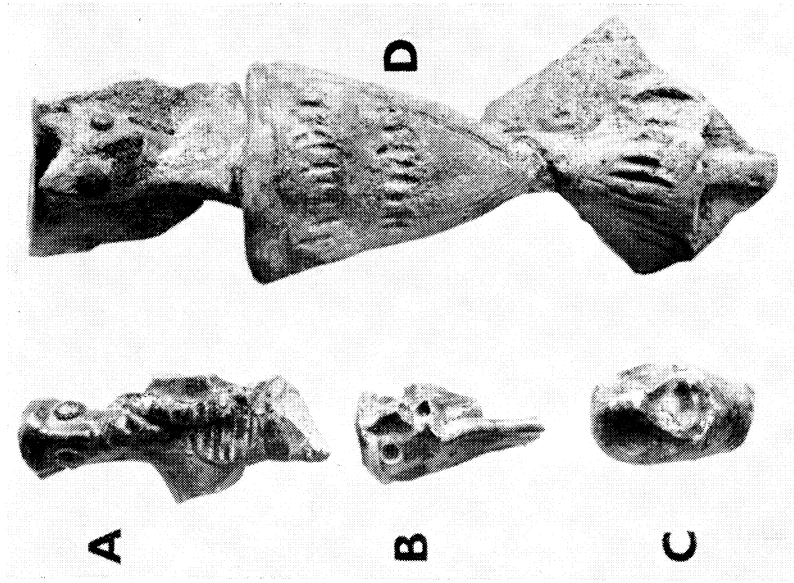
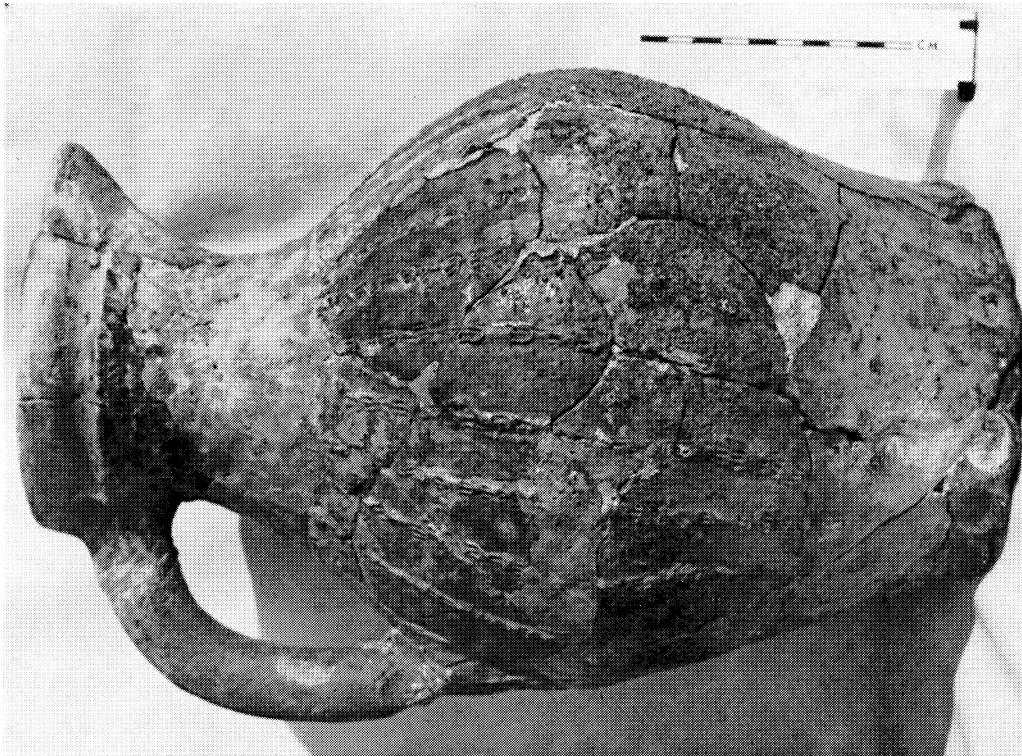

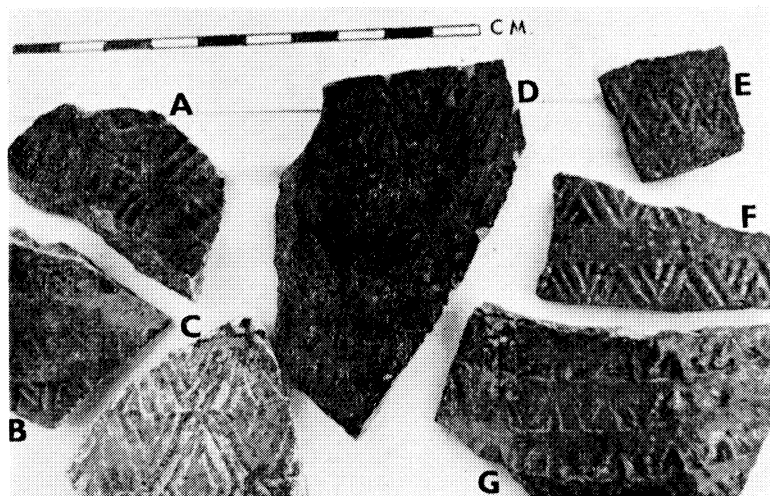

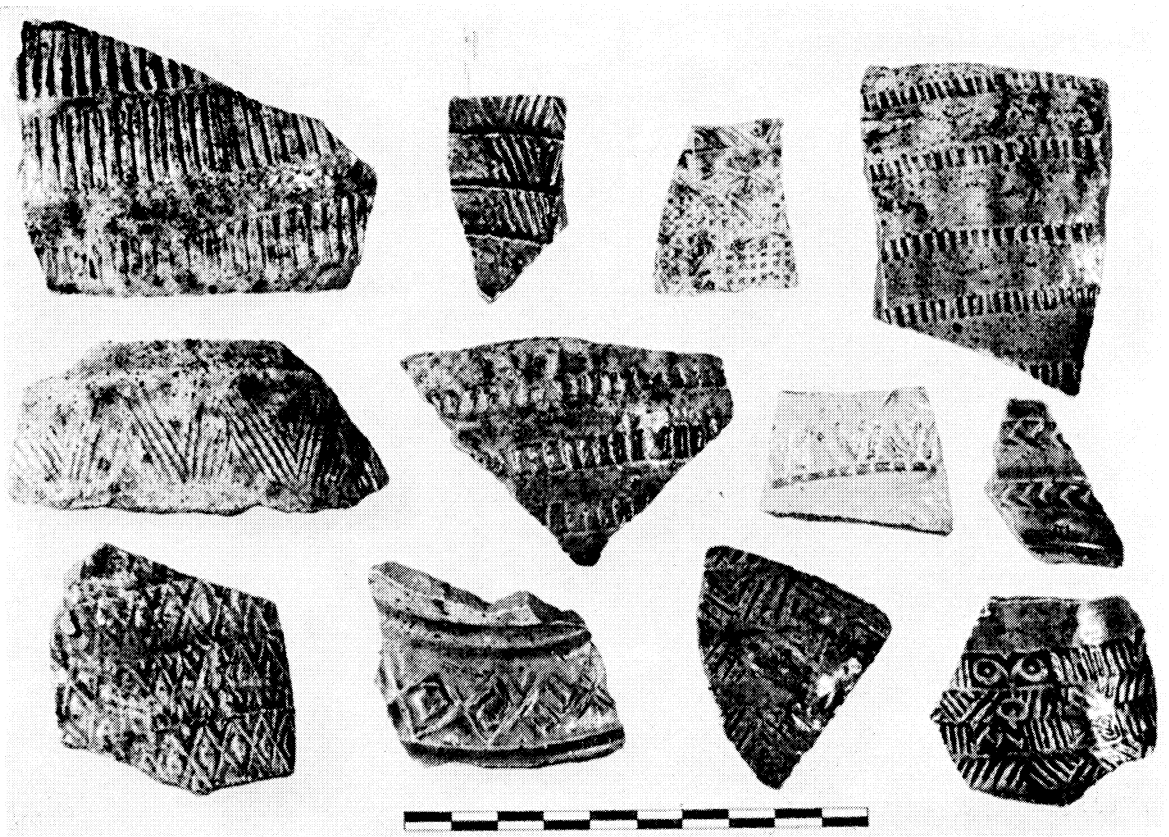

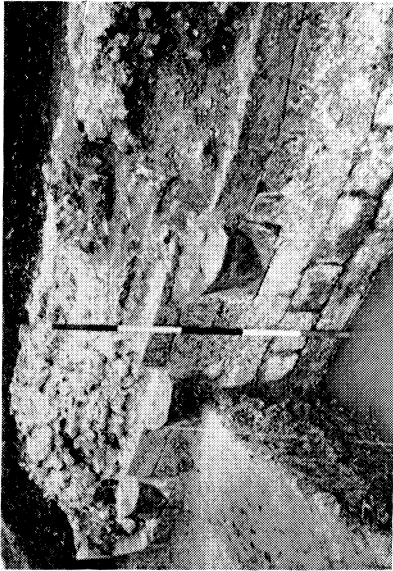

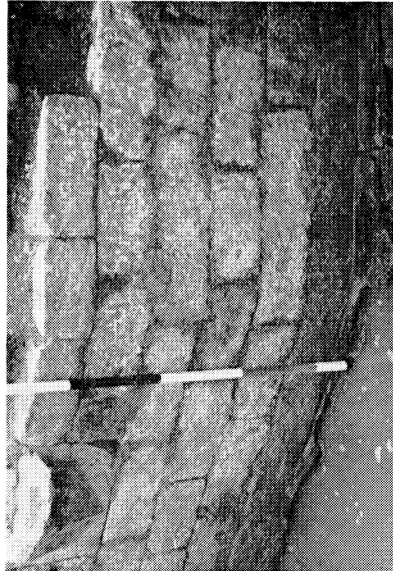

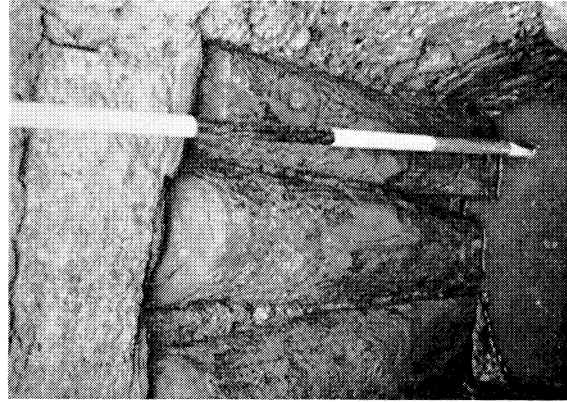

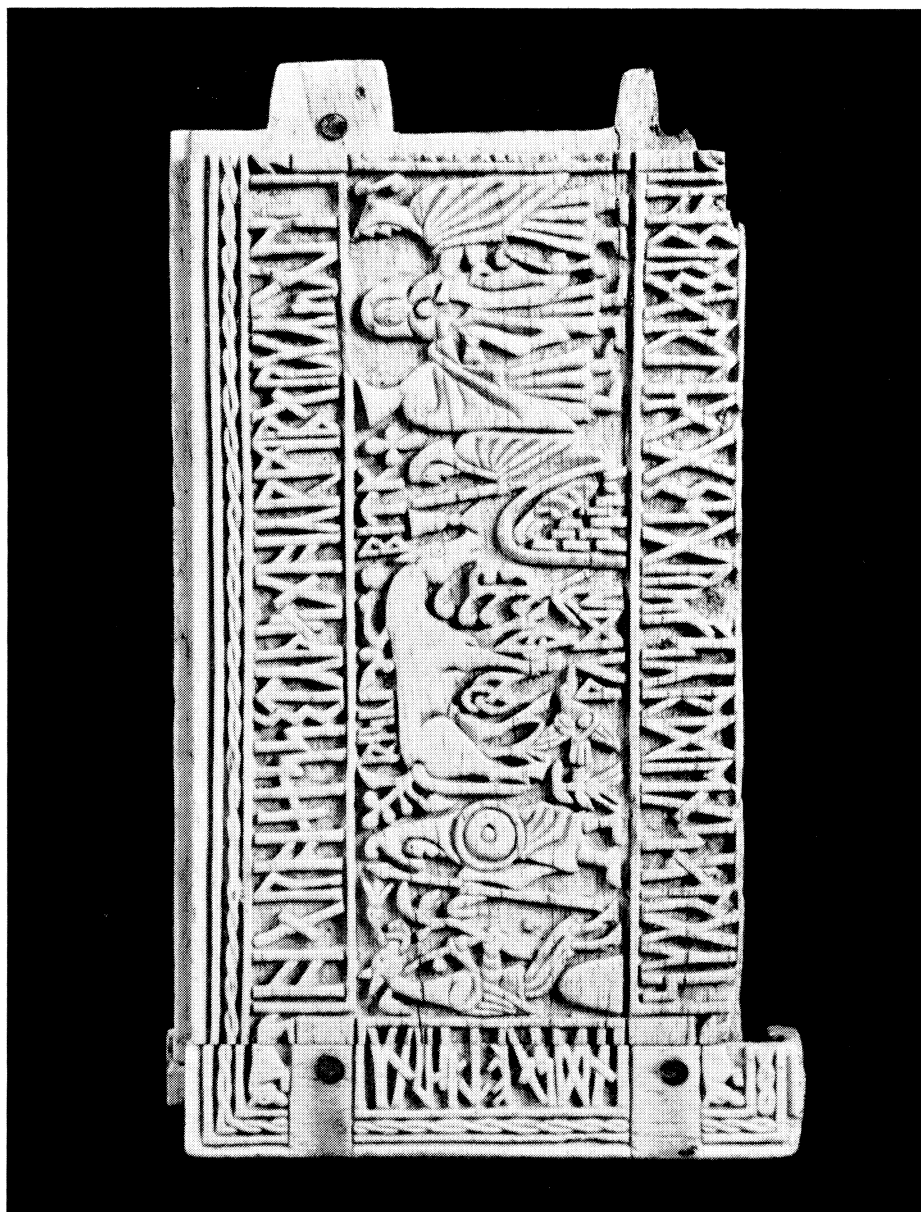
BRIDGE OVER LOWER MILL STREAM, WALTHAM ABBEY, ESSEX (pp. 129, 131, 135)

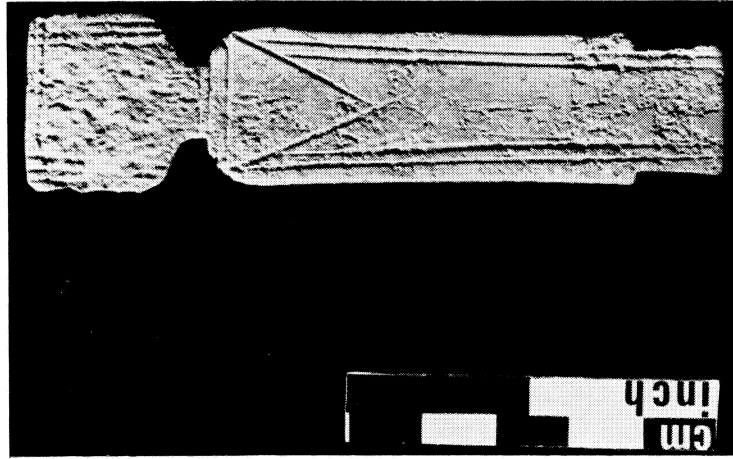


RIGHT-HAND SIDE OF FRANKS CASKET (pp. 148 ff.). Sc. c. $\frac{2}{3}$

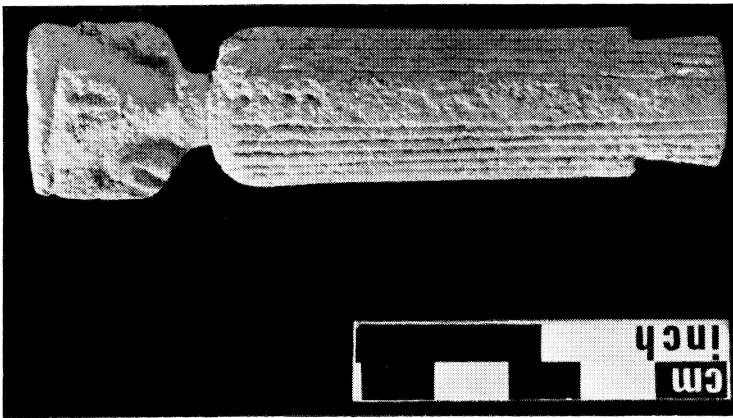

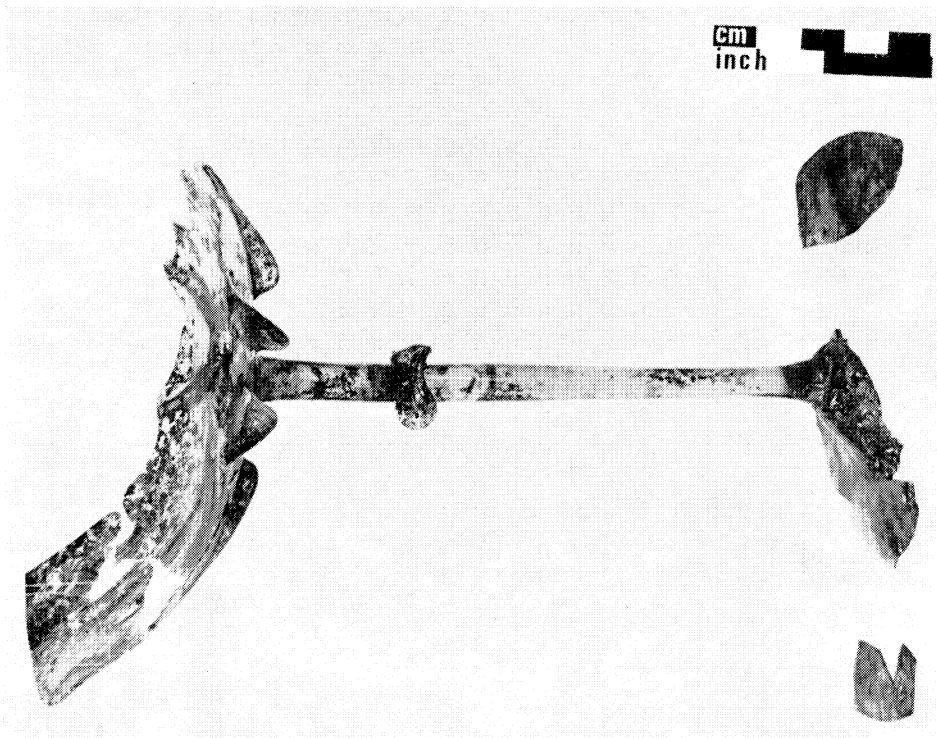
