




EXCAVATIONS AT TRONDHEIM, SITES S AND T


- A. Mid 11th-century (?) timber building with central hearth (p. 13)





- C, D. Brooch fragment (E4) from Cuerdale, Lancs. Front and back. Silver. Sc. 1:1 (pp. 35, 47)






- A. CAERLAVEROCK CASTLE. Bridge A, all phases *in situ*, from top of gatehouse (pp. 55, 74)






DANBURY TILE FACTORY

- B. Staircase ascending from stokepit of Kiln 1, seen from E. (p. 107)




EXPERIMENTAL PRODUCTION OF TILES




EXPERIMENTAL PRODUCTION OF TILES








- A. SWORDS CASTLE, CO. DUBLIN. Tile pavement after excavation (p. 207)


