



A. SALISBURY,


D, Droeway; LH, longhouse settlement; SC, South Channel; vr, Venford Reave.




B. HOOKED TAGS.




PENANNULAR BROOCHES from Wales
A, B from Llys Awel; C from T'rearddur Bay; D from Llanmadog. Scale 1:1




