THE story of Mary Queen of Scots presents points of interest that are exceptional in the range of modern history. Her name stands out not only as that of a great political personage, but as the symbol of an old order of things not so distantly removed as to be deprived of all human warmth and sympathy—revealing the curious conflict of races, the waning of creeds, the ascendancies of families, the entrance and exit upon the historic scene of as varied and motley a set of characters as are ever again to be found upon it.

It is not the intention of this volume to enter upon any portion of the oft told story of the unfortunate Queen, but to form a link with her life and surroundings, and to make real a phase of her character which it is hoped will be welcomed by those who have come under the influence of Mary Queen of Scots.

the writer has taken thoroughly in hand, identifying in almost every case the particular piece of literature that was meant to be indicated in it, and illustrating the whole with a variety of information bearing upon the numerous topics that call for remark in the attentive study of a relic of this kind.

The books which were the companions of Mary, Queen of Scots, cannot fail to have an interest for all who study her career and character. To the students of books, altogether apart from their connection with the Queen of Scots, the volume will be found to contain much that is interesting, inasmuch as the list of works is given in extenso, with information about each which will be serviceable to historians and bibliographers.
