T. Paul's Cathedral has ever been a centre of interest to the citizen of London primarily, and to all English-speaking people more or less. The interest in the Cathedral has varied in character and intensity at different periods, but round it has circled the ever-changing stream of English domestic and ecclesiastical life during the centuries; and to-day, anything which helps to realize that old life or throw light on the surroundings and doings of our forefathers, will be welcomed by antiquaries and students, and also by those who turn rather for recreation to the busy life of the olden times.

The new volume by Dr. W. Sparrow Simpson is a companion to "CHAPTERS IN THE HISTORY OF OLD S. PAUL'S," which was published some years since, and it is indeed a continuation of that work, though in form disconnected from it. 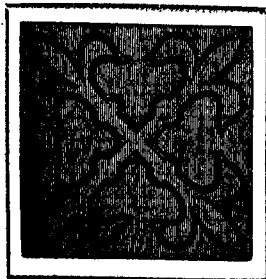
