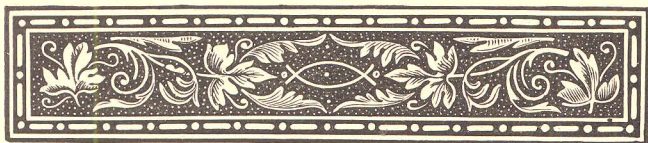

THIS Society (originally founded in 1840, as the Berkshire Ashmolean Society) was re-constituted under its present title in 1871, with the following objects:—(1.) To promote a knowledge of Local History and Antiquities, and the study of Architecture. (2.) To collect and publish information on the Topography, Monuments, and Art collections of the County of Berks, including Genealogy, Heraldry, Numismatics, Parochial Records, and all matters comprised under the head of Archæology. (3.) To preserve from injury or destruction all Monuments and Ancient Remains in the district. (4.) To collect accurate Drawings, Plans, and Descriptions of all Buildings or Objects of Interest within the County.

The Reading Room is open daily for the use of Members. The Librarian attends every Tuesday and Saturday afternoon at 4. Excursions are made during the summer to various localities in the County, or to places of interest within a day's reach. Evening Meetings are held monthly during the winter, when Communications are read, Antiquities exhibited, and Discussion allowed. Prizes are offered by the Society every year for Historical Essays, and for an Architectural Drawing, open to Students in the County. The Annual General Meeting is held in the month of October.

It is earnestly requested that the discovery of any Antiquities within the limits of the Society may be immediately brought to the notice of the Secretary or Librarian.
