¹ Finchampstead (Hundred of Charlton). T. N. p. 110, 122, 127, William Banaster has one fee of the Fee of Robert Achard. ² Fyfield (Hundred of Ock). T. N. p. 109, 121, 126, Philip of Fyfield holds one fee of the Fee of the Earl of Ferrers of the Honour of Tutbury. p. 132, for 19 car. are paid 38s. ³ Fulscot, or Fowescot, West of South Moreton (Hundred of Moreton). ⁴ Frilford (Hundred of Ock). T. N. p. 124, the Abbot of Abingdon holds part of Frilford in demesne in alms and pays no scutage. p. 132, for 12 car. are paid 24s. T. N. p. 110, 121, 127, Philip de St. Helena and Robert de Turbervill have in St. Helen's, Frilford, Lyford, Sutton and Hendred, three fees of the Fee of the Abbot of Abingdon. Comparing Frieliford and Sudtune it is possible that Saluui may be the same as Aluui. Frilford. T. N. p. 121, Henry of Tubney has in Tubney, Uffindin and Frilford four-fifths of a fee of the Fee of the Abbot of Abingdon. ⁵ Frilsham (Hundred of Faircross). T. N. p. 109, 121, 126, Oliver d'Eyncourt has two-thirds of a fee in Frilsham and East Ilsley of the Fee of the Earl of Ferrers, of the Honour of Tutbury (p. 121). p. 132, for 11 car. are paid 22s.

¹ West Ginge, near Lockinge (Hundred of Wantage). T. N. p. 124, the Abbot of Abingdon holds this with other lands in demesne in alms 'nec facit scutagium.' ² Kennington (Hundred of Horner). T. N. p. 121, Thomas Barre has in Kennington one-fifth of a fee of the Fee of the Abbot of Abingdon as of his barony. ³ Goosey (Hundred of Ock). T. N. p. 110, 121, 126, Walter de Gosey has in Gosey one-fifth of a fee of the Fee of the Abbot of Abingdon. p. 124, it is held by the Abbot in demesne in alms and pays no scutage. ⁴ Greenham (Hundred of Faircross). T. N. p. 125, the Master of the Hospital of St. John of Jerusalem has in demesne Greenham, which belonged to the Fee of the Earl of Ferrers, and was given in marriage to Ralph Paynel, whose son gave it to the Brothers of St. John 'nec facit scutagium.' ⁵ West Hagbourne (Hundred of Moreton). T. N. p. 125, William of Windsor holds this in demesne of the barony which he holds of the King in chief 'nec facit scutagium.' ⁶ East Hagbourne. T. N. p. 125, the Abbey and Convent of Cirencester hold this in demesne of the alms of the King's predecessors. ⁷ Hampstead Marshall (Hundred of Kintbury Eagle). T. N. p. 125, Walter Marshall Earl of Pembroke has the Manor of Hamstead in demesne of his marshalry 'et non facit scutagium.' ⁸ East Hanney (Hundred of Wantage). T. N. p. 110, 121, 126, Robert Hemming has one fee of the Abbot of Abingdon as of his barony. p. 124, the Abbot has six hides in alms. p. 132, for ¼ car. is paid 12d. The Vluui of Domesday is the Wlfuui Bullokesegge of A. C. ii. 131. ⁹ East Hanney. T. N. p. 125, the Prior of Noyon has six hides of the alms of the Count of Evreux. p. 132, for one and one-twelfth car. are paid 2s. 2d. ¹⁰ West Hanney. T. N. p. 111, 123, 126, Peter Malherbe and Hugo de St. Maur have half a fee of the Fee of Walter Marshall of the Honour of Giffard. ¹¹ West Hanney. T. N. p. 125, the Prior of Longueville holds half of West Hanney of the alms of the Earl Marshall of the Honour of Giffard. p. 132, for one car. is paid 2s.

¹ East Hanney. T. N. p. 124, 126, among the fees of Elias Gifard, Roger de la Hyde is said to hold one fee of the Fee of Hugo de Vinon (p. 111, *Vium qui habet breve*).

² Hampstead Norris (Hundred of Faircross). T. N. p. 111, 126, William de Sifrewast has in Hamstead, Aldworth and Purley, one fee, which he holds from the King in chief, and has a brief. p. 132, for 18 car. are paid 36s.

³ Harwell. T. N. p. 127, Harwell is an escheat of the King '*de terra Normannorum*.' The Earl of Cornwall holds it of the King's bailiff, and its annual worth is £13 5s. od.

⁴ Harwell (Hundred of Moreton). T. N. p. 125, Brightwell and a portion of Harwell belong to the See of Winton of the alms of a person called Wulward (? Æthelward). See Bristowelle.

⁵ Aldermaston (Hundred of Theale). T. N. p. 119, an account is rendered of one fee belonging to Robert Achard. p. 122, this is said to have formerly belonged to Robert Achard, but now to be held by William de Englefield of the King's bailiff, and to be accounted for to the King by William Revel, along with Finchampstead, Sulhamstead, Colethorp and Woolavington. p. 132, for 21 car. and a fraction are paid 43s. 7½d.

⁶ East Hendred (Hundred of Wantage). T. N. p. 124, the Abbey of Reading holds this in pure and perpetual alms. p. 128, it is worth £25 and was given by Henry the King's father—so that this entry must be of the time of John. p. 132, for two car. are paid 4s.

^{6a} West Hendred? T. N. p. 121, John de Turberville has one hide held of Matthew Huse who holds it and land at Bukeyate (Bechesgete) as one fee of the Fee of the Earl of Ferrers, of the Honour of Tutbury.

⁷ East Hendred. T. N. p. 125, the Prior of Noyon holds ten hides of the alms of the Count of Evreux.

⁸ East Hendred. T. N. p. 125, the Prior of Framton has seven hides of the alms of William Bastard.

⁹ East Hendred. T. N. p. 125, the Prioress of Littlemore has one hide of the alms of the present King.

¹⁰ West Hendred. T. N. p. 125, the Prior of Wallingford holds two-thirds of West Hendred in alms, given to the House of St. Alban by the King's predecessors.
