

Reading Chantries.

HE following Certificates are those returned by the Commissioners, appointed under the Act of 37 Henry VIII., to enquire into the possessions of all Colleges, Hospitals, Chantries, and Free Chapels, objects for which they were founded, names of founders, and annual value. A subsequent return I Edward VI. differs in many particulars.

ST. LAURENCE'S PARISH.

The Chauntry of Jesus there founded by the Mayre or Master of the Gylde and churche Wardens of Seynt Lawrence there by the lycence of the Kyng Henry the VIIth, to thentente to have a preste to execute the devyn servyce dayly in the same church for ever.

The said Chauntre of Jhesus ys scituate within the parishe churche of Seynte Laurence in Reading.

The value of the same Chauntre by yere xiij^{ii.} xvij^{s.} viij^{d.} whereof

And so remayneth viji. iiijs. vjd. whyche ys Imployed towardes the ffyndyng of certen clerks there.

Ornamentes plate juelles goodes and catalles merly appertayning unto the said Chauntre as yt appereth by the Inventory hereunto annexed nott praysed.

One Stipendiary prest there founded by John Clamperd, Citezen and haberdassher of London, and Thomas Justice, Clerke to thentente to have a prest perpetually to synge and saye the devyne servyce dayly in the church there.

The said Stipendiary prest ordened and erected to synge and serve within the parish churche of Seynt Lawrence in Redynge.

ST. MARY'S PARISH.

Colnes Chauntre founded by Thomas Colnes by the licence of Kyng Edward the thyrde to thentente to have a prest to singe masse dayly in the chapell there called Coles Chapell, whych is nott observed accordyng to the same foundacon.

The said Chauntre is situate within the parishe Churche of Seynt Marie in Redynge.

The value of the same Chauntre by yere ix whereof

Ornamentes plate juelles goodes and Catalles merly apperteynyng to the same Chauntre is as it appereth by the Inventorye not yet praysed.

One ffraternytie of Jehsus founded by certeyn of the parochoners of the parishe of Seynt Marye in Redyng of devocion without any corporacion or ffoundacion under seale to thentente to have a prest every holiday in the quyer to serve and every ffrydave to synge Jesus masse at thaulter of Jhesus in the seid churche And hath for his stipend or salary as ffollowith.

The same ffraternitie ys scituate and erected wythin the parish church of Seynt Marye in Readyng.

The value of the same ffraternitie by yere $iiij^{ii.}$ $xj^{s.}$ $iiij^{d.}$ whereof ffor Rents Resolute ... $vij^{s.}$

And so remaynethe iiij^a iiij^a iiij^a whyche the prest doth receyve towards his salerye over and besides certen money to him by thenhabitants there of devocyon yerely.

Ornamentes plate juelles goodes and Catalles merly apperteynynge to the same Chauntre ther are none for yt ys served with thornamentes of the same parish church there.

One Hospital or Almshouse there founded by William Barnes to thentent to have certeyne pore people there lodged and for that purpose he dyde endowe the same house with certen londs and tenements as ffoloweth howbeit the have not shewed any ffondacion or graunte. The same hospytall is scituate within the parishe of seynt Marye in Redynge.

The value of the said hospytall by yere vij^{ll.} vj^{s.} iiij^{d.} whereof ffor Rent resolute... ... xx^{s.}

And so remaynethe vj^{ll.} vj^{s.} iiij^{d.} which is yerely expended for the mayntenaunce of the lodgynges reserved and kept for the pore people and for Repayrynge of the said house there.

Ornamentes plate juelles goodes and Catalles merly apperteynynge to the same hospitall therbe none but only the beds wherein the pore people be lodged not worth the making of an Inventory.

One Almeshouse there founded by John Leche otherwyse called John Larder to thentent to have v. poremen to pray for the soule of the said John and all Christen soules and every of them to have towardes their lyving one house to dwell in And every of them wekely iiij^d to be paid by thands of the mayre of Redynge which ys observed and kepte accordyngly.

The said Almeshouse ys scituate within the parishe church of Seynt Marie in Redyng.

The value of the same almeshouse by yere cvjs. viijd.

And so remaineth iiij^{s.} whyche the Mayre Receyveth towardes the Repayryng of the houses thereunto belongynge.

Ornamentes plate juelles goodes and Catalles merly apperteynyng to the same Almeshouse theyr ar none.

ST. GILES' PARISH.

One ffraternyte of Jhesus founded by Thenhabitantes of the parish of Seynt Gyles in Redyng of devocyon without eny specyall graunte or licence to thentent to have a prest to synge every ffryday Jhesus masse at an aulter called Jhesus aulter. And the said prest hath his stipend yerely payed of the porochynores there. Excepte one tenement whyche one Thomas Drewe dyd put in feoffament, towardes the fyndyng of the same prest the value whereof hereafter folowethe.

The said ffraternytie ys founded and erected within the parishe churche of Seynt Gyles in Redynge. The value of the tenementes thereunto belonginge by yere xij^s whereof.

And so remaineth xj^{s.} iiij^{d.} whyche the pryst Receynith towardes his stipend over and besides vj^{tl.} to hym yerely payd whyche ys collected and gathered of devocyon amonge thenhabitants there.

Ornamentes plate juelles goodes and catalles merly apperteynyng to the same ffraternytie there be none for yt ys served withornamentes of the parish church there.

There is one Chauntrey called Englefeld Chauntrey (ffounded by whome yt ys unknowen onto the Commyssyoners) hath ben dissolved sythe the iiijth of ffebruarye in the xxvij yere of the Kynges hyghnes Reygne by —— Englefeld without the Kynges lycence. The value of the possessions thereof Amountethe to the some of lx^a v^d by yere.

Ornamentes plate juelles goodes and catalles at the dyssolucyon thereof were worthe.*
