### SHILLINGFORD.

(1) This Bell bears a Black letter inscription, of which only part is legible, viz.:—

gloría . . . . . . . . exce gloría **B**eo. W K 1586.

This bell must have been one of the earliest from the Bell Foundry of the Knights of Reading.
