1 Well House, near Hampstead Norris (Hundred of Faircross). T. N. p. 110, 126, Walter de la Wyle has in la Wyle one fee of the Fee of Matthew de Columberes. p. 122, it is said to be of the Fee of the Earl of Devon. Windsor (Hundred of Ripplesmere). T. N. p. 124, the villata of New Windsor and Old Windsor are in the King's hand. Winterbourn, near Chieveley (Hundred of Faircross). T. N. pp. 110, 126, Alan de Farnham and Robert de Anvers in Aston, and Simon de Luvek and the aforesaid Robert de Anvers in Winterborne have one fee of the Fee of the Earl of Warwick. p. 122, two-thirds of this is at Aston, and one-third at Winterborne. The common portion of these estates seems to be that held by the King and of him (T.R.E.) by Lanc.

1 Winterbourn. T. N. pp. 111, 122, 126, Richard fitz John has one fee of the Fee of the son and heir of Robert Musard. p. 132, for 16 car. and a fraction are paid 33s. 5d.

2 Whistley in Hurst, near Twyford (Hundred of Charlton). This was left (A.C. i. 291) to Abingdon Abbey by Wulfstan to whom it had been granted by King Edgar. It belonged, with Winkfield, to the Abbey kitchen and paid 16 sticks of eels (A. C. ii. 308).

3 Long (or West) Wittenham (Hundred of Ock). T. N. pp. 110, 123, John de Plesset, Matthew Huse, William de St. Helena and Robert of Samford hold one fee of the Fee of Walter Marshal, Earl of Pembroke, of the Honour of Giffard. p. 132, for 24\frac{3}{2} car. are paid 48s. 8d. p. 125, Geoffrey of Clifden and Robert of Swynbrok hold two hides of the Prior of Notley who holds them in alms of the Honour of Giffard. D. 56a, one of the acres appropriated T.R.E. to the maintenance of the huscarles was in this manor.

4 Little Wittenham (Hundred of Ock).

T. N. pp. 110, 121, Roger de Wittenham has one fee of the Barony of the Abbot of Abingdon. It was given to the Abbey by Bishop Siward (A. C. i. 461).

5 Whitley near Reading (Hundred of Reading). T. N. p. 124, this with other lands is held by the Abbey of Reading in alms.

6 Wytham (Hundred of Hormer). T. N. p. 121, William Calemond has \(\frac{1}{2} \) of a fee of the Barony of the Abbot of Abingdon. A. C. ii. 6—7, William Chaumun is tenant 'de terra villanorum curiæ Comenor obsequi solitorum.' The estate was given to the Abbey by King Ethelred or Edred (A. C. i. 40, 134). Hubertus is the tenant (A. C. ii. 4).
