CHRONICLES OF FINCHAMPSTEAD.

By WILLIAM LYON.

London: Longman, Green & Co., 1895.

A few copies of this handsome and extremely interesting work by the late Mr. Lyon may still be obtained (15/-). It contains many charming illustrations, and is the result of much patient labour and research on the part of the Author who spared no pains to make his work thorough and complete. It is a model of what a parochial history should be.

The "Times" says:—

Mr. William Lyon's **Chronicles of Finchampstead**, in the county of Berkshire, offer an excellent example to local antiquaries. The book is the result of long and patient investigation of the history of the writer's own neighbourhood; and the result shows how much may be discovered by a zealous student, in a country like England, about the past of almost any parish. Finchampstead is not the scene of any great battle, or of any political events of high importance; it is just a village in an interesting part of England, traversed by the great Roman road from Bath to London, possessing an old church, and the seat of an ancient manor, the lords of which now and again made a figure in the public life of their time. By dint of a careful study of such records as the parish contains, following up hints given by names and allusions, and tracing out whatever memorials exist—for instance, of the Banastre or Banister family—Mr. Lyon has produced a volume which will always in future take its place among the histories of Berkshire and the local histories of England generally. As might be expected, the ecclesiastical part of the volume is the fullest and, perhaps the best, the Church records having been more accurately kept than those of the manors and parish at large. But Mr. Lyon has by no means been satisfied with these, and his genealogical tables, his extracts from MSS. in the British Museum, and his record of the recent history of the parish and district are very full and thorough.
