The History of Littlecote.

LITTLECOTE HALL, as it was formerly called, is one of the most interesting specimens of an early Tudor Mansion to be found in England. Surrounded by a finely-wooded park of four miles in circumference, and flanked by a lofty knoll, covered with stately timber, with a branch of the Kennet, famous for trout, flowing through the grounds, there are few more picturesque country houses than this long irregular building, with its quaint chimney stacks and many gables. It was originally built by the Darells, on the site of an older manor-house, but for generations has been successively the family mansion of the Pophams and Leybourne-Pophams. To an architectural mind the place is simply delightful on account of its almost perfect state of preservation. With few exceptions the old country houses of this period have been allowed to fall out of repair by absentees, or more completely ruined by being modernised, "restored," and vulgarised,
